Ground Breaking For Patriot Park

Saratoga Springs is excited to announce the ground breaking of Patriot Park. This new 30-acre sports complex will include six baseball fields, eight pickle ball courts, a playground, batting cages, concession stands and a Veteran's monument, honoring our service men and women from each branch. It is anticipated that the park will open in time for 2019 spring sports.

"It's a community gathering place!"

This year marks the 20th Anniversary of Saratoga Springs. Our community is growing at a rapid pace and is in the need of more places for the community to gather. Patriot Park is a great first step as we continue to move forward to make that possible.

No longer are we just a place to reside and go to sleep. This is a place where families get together to play ball, to get to know each other

and create a community where grandparents will come, and our kids will play. Patriot Park was four years in the making and represents more than just a baseball field—it's a community gathering place!

Redwood Road Improved Update

NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN

Sections of Redwood Road traffic will be shifted to the west side of the road. This traffic shift will allow room for crews to begin demolition activities and utility work on the east side of Redwood Road. Drivers should be aware of new traffic patterns and drive cautiously.

WIDENING: 400 SOUTH TO LAKE VIEW TERRACE ROAD

Redwood Road: Drainage work is ongoing as crews install drainage pipes and concrete boxes; additionally, traffic signal installation continues at Grandview Boulevard. Crews expect to begin utility work and roadway reconstruction on the east side of the road.

Grandview Boulevard & Lake View Terrace Road: Crews are installing curb and gutter and sidewalks on Lake View Terrace Road. Pedestrian ramps are being upgraded to comply with federal standards. Pedestrians should avoid construction areas.

RESURFACING:

Village Parkway south, approximately 10 miles: Crews will install a guardrail near mile marker 21, which is about four miles south of Harbor Parkway. One-way flagging will be used during this operation to allow room for work.

Storm Water Preparation for Winter





Holiday Shopping & ATM Safety Tips

The holiday season is a special time of year. It is also a time when busy people become vulnerable to theft and other holiday crime. We can be careful, prepared and aware. Please share this information with family, friends and neighbors. The Saratoga Springs Police Department wishes you a safe, happy and peaceful holiday season.

Shopping

- Shop during daylight hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with someone else.
- Dress casually and comfortably.
- Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.
- Always carry your Driver License or ID Card.
- Stay alert to your surroundings.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.

- Keep cash in your front pocket.
- Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.
- Keep a record of all of your credit card numbers in a safe place at home.
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages. Maintain clear visibility and freedom of motion.

Automated Teller Machine (ATM)

- If you must use an ATM, choose one that is located inside a business, mall, or well-lit location.
- Protect your PIN by shielding the ATM keypad from anyone who is standing near you.
- Do not throw your ATM receipt away at the ATM location.
