20th Anniversary Celebrations: A Look Back

The 20th Anniversary Celebrations last year highlighted our amazing community, the incredible quality of life Saratoga Springs offers and why we say, "Life's just better here."

The year was not short on fun things to do or ways to get involved with our annual events. The year started with 8th Annual Miss Saratoga Springs Pageant. This unique event is one of the only pageants in the state that does not include a swim suit competition and focuses on ways contestants give back to the local community.

To commemorate the 20th Anniversary, the City introduced several new components to our annual celebrations. A couple of these new components included participating for the first time in the Days of 47 Parade and creating photo contests. In fact, a majority of the scenic photos you now see in the City's revamped website and newsletter are submissions by your friends and neighbors.

The week-long Splash celebration in 2017 was also cram-packed with new and traditional activities. It included a chalk walk, carnival, game and movie nights, an Amazing Race, basketball and volleyball tournaments, a Grand Parade, and our Splash Bash Water Party!

After Splash, we implemented a 20th Anniversary Summer Concert Series, held every Monday evening. These weekly events included the ever-popular Food Truck League, local bands, the City Orchestra, movie nights, crafts,

a reptile show, and a 9/11 fireworks show with the Utah National Guard 23rd Army Band.

Building off of the momentum of the summer we moved right into the Fall Festival. Surprised by the overwhelming attendance the prior year, the City geared up even more for 2017--and glad we did--as attendance doubled with approximately 6,000 residents.

But why stop the celebrations there? Amidst all the fun, the Mayor and City Council broke ground for Patriot Park, a new 30-acre complex with six baseball fields, eight pickle ball courts, a playground, batting cages, concession stands and a Veteran's monument, honoring our service men and women from each branch. It is anticipated that the park will open in time for 2019 spring sports.

To keep the snowball rolling from the summer and fall events, we also implemented a Holiday Home Decoration contest, which received 17 registrations and nearly 900 votes! This was a wonderful compliment to the Holiday season's annual Messiah performance and the Holiday Concert by the City Orchestra.

To close out the year, we ended with another bang by adding a brief fireworks show to the annual Christmas Tree Lighting, along with a visit from the big man himself and his right-hand lady--Mr. and Mrs. Claus.

The City of Saratoga Springs hopes that you had an amazing year with us celebrating the 20th Anniversary and wish you a Happy New Year in 2018!

The Saratoga Springs Veterans Advisory Council (VAC) will soon send out a flyer and enable a form on the City website at www.saratogaspringscity.com/veteran to allow veterans within the city to provide contact information to the committee.

The VAC will use this information to update veterans about opportunities, events, and changes to legislation that may impact them. They will send out information about programs, such as the Utah County Tax Abatement, which allows disabled veterans and active duty service members to pay a reduced amount of property tax. This program can reduce property tax to zero, and allow reduced or even free registration of vehicles as well!

Those currently serving on the Veterans Advisory Council are Ruth Caldwell, Emily Mount and Carl Sachs.

About Carl

Carl is the first and current chair of the new Veteran's Advisory Council. He

was born and raised in Sandy, Utah, and went to Alta High School. He joined the Army as a Cryptologic Language Analyst straight out of High School in 1996 and spent just over 20 years on Active Duty as an enlisted Soldier.

He was stationed in California, Korea, Kentucky, Texas, Iraq, Hawai'i, and Maryland. Carl's duty positions included Team Leader, Squad Leader, Platoon Sergeant, Watch NCO, Basic Instructor, Senior Instructor, Course Supervisor, and Operations Sergeant.

His proudest military accomplishment is induction into the prestigious Sergeant Audie Murphy Club in 2010. During training in Utah in 2012, he visited Saratoga Springs and fell in love with the City, and decided to retire here.
