Pony Express Parkway Widening

To accommodate current and future traffic demands, Eagle Mountain and Saratoga Springs will widen Pony Express Parkway from two lanes to five lanes from Porters Crossing to Redwood Road. This project will be constructed in two phases.

Phase One: Beginning late February, 2018, construction crews are scheduled to extend two culverts where the Welby-Jacobs Canal and the Utah Lake Distributing Canals cross under the roadway, and several irrigation pipe crossings between Thunder Boulevard

(200 West in Saratoga Springs) and Redwood Road. This work is to be completed by early April 2018.

Phase Two: The second phase will be to widen Pony Express Parkway. Crews are scheduled to begin road construction by late spring. Work will continue throughout the summer with an expected completion by fall 2018.

School entrances will stay open during the school year and two traffic lanes will remain open on Pony Express Parkway. Between June and August, accesses may

be periodically closed at times while crews build the improvements. Motorists can use State Route 73 as an alternative route.

Please use caution and obey all signs and posted speeds when driving through the construction zone. The construction schedule is subject to change for various reasons such as, equipment problems, inclement weather, and emergency situations. Amended Utility Shut Off Policy

On February 6, 2018, the City Council amended Saratoga Springs' water utility Shut Off Policy for delinquent bills. The amendment changed the Shut Off Policy from 60 days to 30 days.

The intent of the change is to bring delinquent customer bills to their attention

Library: Temporary Closure, Feb 24 - Mar 26



The Saratoga Springs Public Library will be closed for flooring repairs from February 24th, 2018 to March 26th, 2018. These repairs are essential for everyone's safety.

We are aware of the inconvenience that this interruption of service will cause, and have taken the following measures to minimize the impact of this closure:

- Items that would fall due during the closure will have a due date of April 2nd, 2018.
- On February 5th, our item limit will temporarily increase to 150 items

total per adult card, including 3 kits, 5 video games, and 30 DVDs.

- Please do not return Saratoga Springs Public Library items to other libraries.
- Staff will continue to monitor voice mail and respond when able.
- Our website and BookMyne app will continue to function for renewals.
- We will be in the city council chambers from 10 AM to noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays. During this time, a limited selection of items will be available to checkout. We will also run our Music & Movement program at 10:30 AM and our Little Builders

program from 11 AM to noon in the council chambers.

The American Fork, Eagle Mountain, and Lehi libraries have all agreed to provide temporary cards to Saratoga Springs residents free of charge. These cards will be valid from February 26th to April 30th, 2018.

Saratoga Springs City Mobile App

The City of Saratoga Springs implemented a resident app in 2016. Since that time, residents have submitted hundreds of requests to the City on various issues including parks, code enforcement issues, and street lights. City staff appreciate this resident feedback and seek to fulfill those requests as quickly as possible.

To download the app, go to either the App Store (iOS) or Google Play Store (Android) and search for "Saratoga Springs City Mobile". Then, follow the instructions in order to send a request. In addition, if you do not have a smartphone, the City

website has a "Report a Concern" page that allows you to submit a request via the website. Given the increased usage, the City would like to clarify proper usage of the app. Below are proper request parameters.

Requests:

- Are detailed and include adequate information
- Include a picture if possible
- Are relevant to issues within the boundaries of Saratoga Springs and within the legal jurisdiction of the City

Some requests are not appropriate.

Here are some guidelines of what is NOT appropriate:

- Requests that are time sensitive
- Requests that report a current or ongoing criminal activity (these should be reported IMMEDIATELY to the police)
- Requests that are vague or ambiguous in nature
