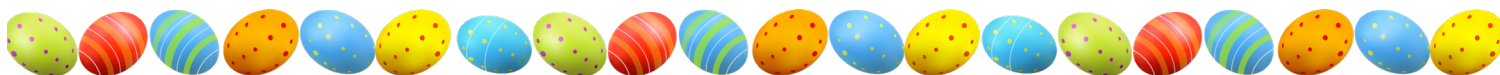

Redwood Road Construction Update

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is improving Redwood Road south of Pioneer Crossing in Saratoga Springs to reduce congestion, improve mobility and extend the life of the roadway.

Construction resumed mid-March 2018 to complete pavement resurfacing, landscaping and utility work between 400 South and Grandview Boulevard. This work as well as the new trail from Pioneer Crossing to 400 South are expected to be complete by summer 2018. Construction

is expected to begin summer 2018 for the following improvements:

- New east-west Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI) at Pioneer Crossing
- Widened road (from three to five lanes between Lake View Terrace Road and Village Parkway)
- New traffic signals at Ring Road and Stillwater Drive
- New bike signal at Pony Express Parkway
- Extended bike lanes from 400

South to Village Parkway

Spring Clean-Up From May 12 - 21, 2018

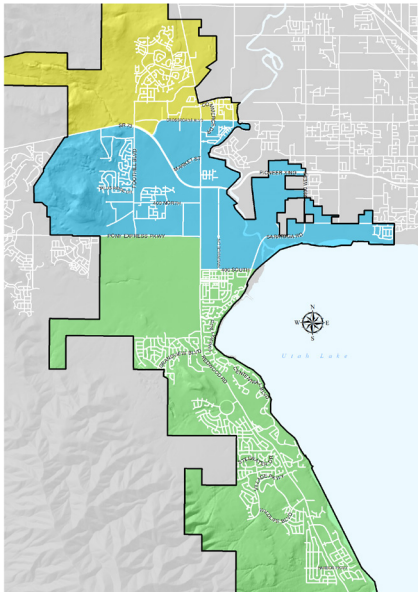
The City has consolidated the dumpster locations for spring cleanup again this year. The Spring Cleanup location is at the City's Public Works site located on Saratoga Road at 900 E Saratoga Springs.

This will be the only dumpster location in the City. We are only offering one location to ensure that dumpsters

are available for use. Previously, the dumpsters located throughout the City would fill quickly and not be available for use. Having multiple dumpsters at one location will ensure that each dumpster is hauled away and a new one is delivered as soon as possible ensuring that they are available for residents' use.

Just a reminder, this service is

provided only for bagged household and/or green waste items. Furniture, electronics, oil/fuel, kitchen appliances, tires, rocks and concrete are not to be placed in these dumpsters. Utah County has a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on April 14th from 9am-3pm. For more details visit www.utahcountyhealth.org/hhw.

Updated Garbage & Recycling

Republic services will begin implementation of a new garbage and recycling pick-up schedule, starting April 4, 2018. Residents north of Crossroads Boulevard/SR-73 (Yellow) and South of

400 North (Green) will not be affected. Residents between Crossroads Boulevard/SR-73 and South of 400 North (Blue) will now have garbage pick-up every Wednesday and recycling pick-up every other Friday.

Secondary Water Dates & Info

The City of Saratoga Springs will begin turning on the secondary (irrigation water) starting the week of April 15th. In order to help the system charge faster we ask residents to turn your individual secondary

water valve to the off position. This will protect your sprinkling system and allow you to test for water leaks. If you have questions or concerns please contact the Public Works Department at (801)766-6506.

Lawn Care & Weeds

It's springtime! Which means weeds will be growing. This month's message we wanted to address weeds. City code (10.10.03.09.B) properties with weeds higher than six inches, creates a fire hazard, and habitat for vector or vermin are prohibited.

City ordinance 19.06.08 requires within the first year front yard and park strips shall be landscaped. Interior side and back yards shall be landscaped within the second year.

Exchange canned goods & other food items for library overdue fines to help Tabitha's Way Local Food Pantry during Food for Fines, April 9th-April 23rd 2018, at the Saratoga Springs Public Library.

Library members will get \$0.50 in current fines* waived for each can or package of the following foods:

- Peanut butter and other nut butters
- Canned meats (chicken, tuna or salmon)
- Canned fruits or vegetables
- Cereal
- Pasta
- Canned and boxed meals (soup, chili, stew, macaroni & cheese)
- Canned or dried beans
- Rice
- Baking mixes
- Baby Essentials (formula, food, snack)
- Cooking oil
- Bring canned goods, or other food items to the circulation desk at your library. Don't forget to bring your library card!
- No drop-offs please
- No open or used items
- No perishable items
- No homemade items

* Food for Fines does NOT include replacement fees for lost or damaged materials, collection agency fees, card replacement fees, and future overdue fines. There is a limit of \$20.00 which may be waived with food items.
