## FatCats a Sign of Things to Come!

FatCats recently held its groundbreaking for the company's first movie theater and fully-integrated entertainment complex in Utah at The Crossing in Saratoga Springs.

This multimillion dollar investment in Saratoga Springs is a 7-acre, 61,000 sqft facility, with eight luxury movie theaters, 20 bowling lanes, an arcade, a full-service grill, mini-golf, and three to four virtual reality rooms with the ability to rotate through 80 different virtual reality scenarios based on the season.

While a movie theater and bowling alley might seem like basic amenities to some, we could not be more thrilled to welcome FatCats to our community.

Over the years, residents of Saratoga Springs and those in the Northwest region of Utah County have had to drive east and elsewhere, on over-congested roads, simply to go shopping, get to work, or even see a movie with their family.

When businesses like FatCats make their home in our community, it not only provides added value to the quality of life for current residents, it is

telling of other things just around the corner.

In recent months and years, we have seen significant announcements made in economic development in the Northwest region of Utah County. These announcements blatantly demonstrate the economic viability of the region, as well as significant strides in economic development that are quickly catching up to the rapid residential growth in our area.

In recognizing this unprecedented growth, the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) has begun significant transportation projects in Saratoga Springs.

These transportation projects are located next to the heart of our primary commercial district and place Saratoga Springs squarely at the center of major expansions in the Northwest region of Utah County, including projects like Mountain View Corridor, which create a new western gateway between Utah County and Salt Lake County, and provide a long-overdue, alternate route to the bottle-neck on I-15.

## Phase II: Redwood Road Widening Project

To accommodate current and future traffic demands, Eagle Mountain and Saratoga Springs will widen Pony Express Parkway from two lanes to five lanes from Porters Crossing to Redwood Road. This project will be constructed in two phases.

**Phase One:** Beginning late February, 2018, construction crews began work to extend two culverts where the Welby-Jacobs Canal and the Utah Lake Distributing Canals cross under the roadway, and several irrigation pipe crossings between Thunder Boulevard (200 West in Saratoga Springs) and Redwood Road. This work was completed early April 2018.

**Phase Two:** The second phase will be to widen Pony Express Parkway. Crews began road construction late spring. Work will continue throughout the summer

with an expected completion by fall 2018.

School entrances will stay open during the school year and two traffic lanes will remain open on Pony Express Parkway. Between June and August, accesses may be periodically closed at times while crews build the improvements. Motorists can use State Route 73 as an alternative route.

Please use caution and obey all signs and posted speeds when driving through the construction zone. The construction schedule is subject to change for various reasons such as, equipment problems, inclement weather, and emergency situations. ## New Tech Provides Hourly Reads

Saratoga Springs is proud to announce it has begun the deployment of advanced water metering technology. This system is a “Fixed network” that allows for automated readings of water meters throughout the City.

This initial deployment will include the installation of 13 collector antennas throughout the City that will communicate directly with the culinary and secondary water meters sending hourly read data directly to the City’s billing system.

When completed, this Fixed Network system will provide the City the ability to

improve customer service through a more detailed understanding of water usage along with the ability to more thoroughly investigate billing questions and concerns.

Another benefit of having hourly read data is being able to quickly identify and notify residents of leaks on the user side of the meter.

The City rollover to a Fixed Network read system will take approximately 12-18 months and will occur without any interruption to water service.

## 2018 Fireworks Regulations

### DISCHARGE

Between the hours of 11am and 11pm except as noted:

- July 2 – July 5 (July 4th hours extended to midnight)
- July 22 – 25 (July 24th hours extended to midnight)
- December 31\* (Extended to 1am January 1)
- Chinese New Year's Eve (Extended to 1am the following day)

### SALES

Class “C” fireworks can be sold the following dates:

- June 24 – July 25
- December 29 – December 31st
- 2 days before and on Chinese New Year's Eve

*\*If New Year's eve is on a Sunday and the county, municipality, or metro township determines to celebrate New Year's eve on the prior Saturday (Dec 30), then a person may discharge Class C common state approved explosives on that prior Saturday within the county, municipality, or metro township;*

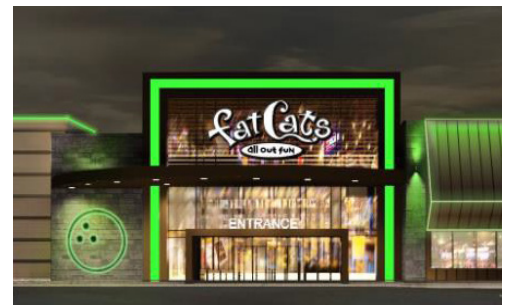
## CONT. FatCats a Sign of Things to Come!
