Phase II: Redwood Road Widening Project

Pioneer Crossing and Redwood Road Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI)

Drivers can expect ongoing traffic shifts and periodic lane closures on Pioneer Crossing and Redwood Road near the intersection. Traffic is shifted on Riverside Drive while crews work on utilities and reconstruct the intersection. To view a CFI overview video, visit udot.utah.gov/redwoodsaratoga.

Redwood Road (Lake View Terrace Road to Village Parkway)

The speed limit has been reduced to 35 mph between Lake View Terrace Road and Village Parkway until the end of the project. Paving of the east side is scheduled for late October. Drivers can expect new traffic patterns as soon as the first week in November.

Side street intersections continue to

be reconstructed at Bliss Drive, Centennial Boulevard and Fairway Boulevard in order to accommodate the future elevation of Redwood Road.

All construction activities and traffic changes are weather-dependent and subject to change. Construction is expected to slow down during the winter months. Work will resume in spring 2019.

Snow Removal & Winter Parking Restrictions

During the winter months, the City's goal is to keep the streets safe for travel. The City is responsible for more than 90 miles of road, equating to about 180 miles of plowing.

With the snow season creeping up on us we wanted to reach out and let the public know of rules about parking vehicles on the street during the winter months.

Under City Code 19.18.10, Parking During Snow Removal From Streets, it reads, "It is illegal for the owner or driver

of any vehicle to park, cause, or allow to be parked such vehicle upon a City street or right-of-way during a snowstorm when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, or following a snowstorm when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, and the City's snow removal equipment has not yet been utilized to remove the snow."

The Streets Department has also asked that all portable basketball stands are removed off of the roadways.

City crews conduct snow removal

and road salting operations around the clock, if necessary during winter storms. In order to achieve this, the City has a prioritized sequence in which the roads will be plowed and salted.

Residents are reminded not to park vehicles on roadways during or immediately after a snowstorm to allow snow plows to clear roadways.

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Miss Saratoga Springs Scholarship Pageant. We are excited to announce a new addition to the event: the Little Miss Saratoga Springs Essay Contest. It is open to young girls who are in 4th through 6th grades and are a resident of Saratoga Springs.

Those who wish to participate will need to fill out an application that can be found at www.saratogaspringscity.com/misssaratogasprings and write an essay that is no longer than a one page, single sided 8 1/2 x 11 paper on the topic "How can I make Saratoga Springs a better community."

Applications and essays will be accepted at the city offices beginning

Monday, February 11th through Friday, February 15, 2019 at 5pm. Only the first 25 applications and essays will be accepted.

The top 10 essays will move on to the second phase of the competition and the contestants and a parent will be invited to attend a luncheon on Saturday, March 2nd at 11:00am at the city offices. Each contestant will then participate in a 5 minute interview about their essay with a panel of judges.

The three top winners will become our 2019 Little Miss Saratoga Springs. The winners will be chosen based on the content of the essay including grammar and punctuation as well as the interview.

They will be introduced at the 2019 Miss Saratoga Springs Scholarship pageant this same night at 7pm. They will get to attend city events throughout the year and work alongside our Miss Saratoga Springs royalty and serve as representatives of our community.

Information for the 2019 Miss Saratoga Springs Scholarship pageant which is open to young women ages 16-21 in our city can also be found on the city website beginning December 1st. The pageant meetings kick off on January 17, 2019 and the pageant will be held on Saturday, March 2nd at 7pm at Vista Heights Middle School.


