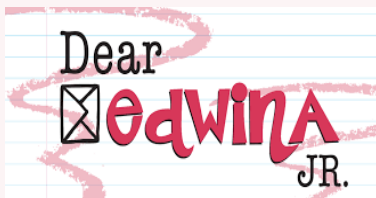

New Ambulance

This Saratoga Springs Fire and Rescue were able to put into service the new Medic Ambulance 261 in March. It's an exact replica of the current Medic Ambulance 262 that was placed into service a year ago. Medic Ambulance 261 will replace our old Dodge ambulance which has spent the last 8 years servicing the north end of Saratoga Springs.

As a department we currently face many challenges that are unique to one of Utah's fastest growing cities. An ever increasing amount of 911 calls is our number one challenge.

Another issue is the upcoming construction of Intermountain

Healthcare and University of Utah Hospital facilities within our city boundaries.

These new hospitals will create a new type of 911 calls, namely inter-facility transports of critical patients.

These key challenges have greatly impacted the development of these two ambulances which have been outfitted to operate as critical care ambulances. They give us opportunities to develop our critical care program and to train and certify our department personnel to be prepared for these new types of 911 responses.

In addition to the challenges listed above we have implemented a new

program that gets the most effective use out of these trucks.

Ambulances are the number one fire apparatus that succumbs to the most wear and tear. They are the vehicles that need to be replaced most often. When the time comes to retire these ambulances, the chassis will be rotated and remounted to be our city response brush trucks.

This allows us to be more efficient in our budgets and get more use positively affecting multiple disciplines within Saratoga Springs Fire and Rescue Department.



Redwood Road Construction Update

Construction has resumed on UDOT's Redwood Road project, which is scheduled to be complete by late summer 2019.

Crews continue to widen Redwood Road between Lake View Terrace Road and Village Parkway, to finish the expansion of the road. Work on the Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI) at Pioneer Crossing is also ongoing while crews reconstruct parts of the road for the new configuration.

New traffic signals will be installed this summer at Parkway Boulevard, Ring Road and Stillwater Drive.

Drivers should expect traffic shifts, lane closures and reduced speed limits throughout work zones.

Efficient Watering Creates A Great Lawn

Once again it's spring time and with that comes new problems as we recharge the irrigation systems throughout our city.

The first item we should look for as we turn the irrigation water valve on, which comes off the street and heads towards our house, is to check for sprinklers, pipes, valves and drip lines that may be leaking or that may have been damaged from the long cold winter.

As you fix those small items we also look for sprinklers in each zone for over-spraying. When you find these sprinklers over-spraying

onto sidewalks or driveways adjust them so the water is going onto the grass only and not running precious water down the curb and into a storm drain.

It's important that we all do our part to slow the flow and save H2O. It could be as easy as adjusting sprinklers and reducing the water time.

Try it this year, adjust a couple of items and see if it doesn't save you a little, and a little can add up to a lot. Always remember, let's leave it better than the way we found it.

Watering Regulations

Irrigation systems may not be turned on between **10am and 6pm** unless you are establishing new grass or performing maintenance on your system. This schedule has been set up by the State and also allows time for the wells to recharge.

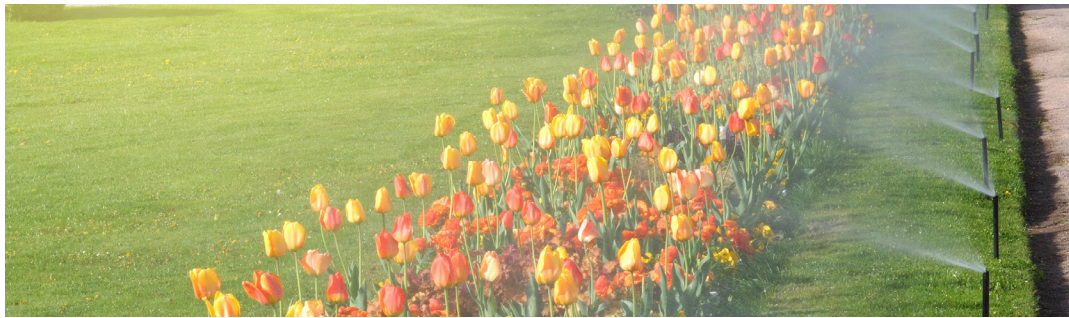
Cross connections between the culinary and irrigation water lines are illegal, and can carry a fine.

If you think your lines may be cross connected and would like it checked, please contact the Public Works department. They

can help determine if a line is cross connected and if so, assist you on how to go about getting it fixed.

During the month of May, sprinklers typically need to be run only about once a week.
