Emergency Tip #2: Kits

We hope all your fall plans are underway and preparing for the winter months. As the days get shorter, this is a great time of year to work on projects inside the home regarding Preparedness.

This is #2 of 12 installments that will be recurring each month. October of each year will be "Do you have an emergency plan". In keeping with that, each November will be "Get an Emergency Kit". So where does one begin?

Assemble and maintain a portable 72-hour emergency kit containing items designed to support each individual with vital health & personal items for two or three days away from home. Of the most likely responses to a wide range of emergencies, the possibility of evacuation should drive this effort.

Keep your personal kit simple, light in weight, and easy to update according to seasonal and other variables. Any of a long

list of possible carrying options may prove practical, including a compact backpack, which leaves hands free.

Of primary importance is a flashlight and battery radio together with fresh backup-up batteries for each.

Other important items often overlooked might include essential



medications, some cash money ("plastic" might not work), and a list of key contact information. Position your kit(s) with quick access in mind.

Acquire a wagon or pull behind

device to help transport heavy items such as water. The recommended allotment of water is, a gallon of water per person, per day. This can quickly add up to a lot of weight! (8.8 lbs per gallon of water)

Do not allow your wagon or pull behind device to be utilized for anything else so you have it when needed if you can.

Again, doing nothing is not an option if you desire any kind of positive outcome for you and your family in an emergency. If you have to utilize your kit at any time, it more than likely will be a very challenging time in your life...

Snow Removal & Winter Parking

During the winter months, the City's goal is to keep the streets safe for travel. The City is responsible for more than 90 miles of road, equating to about 180 miles of plowing.

With the snow season creeping up on us we wanted to reach out and let the public know the rules about parking vehicles on the street during the winter months.

Under City Code 19.18.10, Parking During Snow Removal From Streets, it reads, "It is illegal for the owner or driver of any vehicle to park, cause, or allow to be parked such vehicle upon a City street or right-of-way during a snowstorm when a measurable amount

of snow has fallen, or following a snowstorm when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, and the City's snow removal equipment has not yet been utilized to remove the snow."

The Streets Department has also asked that all portable basketball stands are removed off of the roadways.

City crews conduct snow removal and road salting operations around the clock, if necessary, during winter storms. In order to achieve this, the City has a prioritized sequence in which the roads will be plowed and salted.

Residents are reminded not to park vehicles on roadways during or

immediately after a snowstorm to allow snow plows to clear roadways.
