Emergency Tip #7: Outfitting Your Car

We spend a tremendous amount of our time in our vehicles. It goes without saying that preparing our vehicles for all circumstances should be part of our overall preparation.

Outfit the family vehicle(s) with items, which will add to its safety and security in various emergency and everyday situations, with an eye to the changing of seasons and circumstances.

Make it a matter of habit to keep the fuel level above the halfway mark. Such obvious items as a blanket, heavy-duty flashlight, and container of drinking water, a collapsible shovel, a basic first aid kit and jumper cables are a start.

Some high energy snack bars and weather-conscious clothing items are good additions. A form of communication, whether a cell phone, or two way radio,

could mean the difference in any vital situation.



Caring For Storm Drains

With the cold weather still lingering and the snow melting at a slow pace, it is easy to forget or even pay attention to what is going into our storm drains. This is a good time to observe the quality of water draining into our storm drains, because it ends up in our lake and river systems.

If you notice any rainbow-like sheens on the water draining into a storm drain inlet, please observe where it may be coming from. A light sheen is understandable, but please report a heavy sheen.

Light rains are also a good time to check if our storm drain basins are

properly working. Often, trash, debris, leaves or other material may have been washed into a storm drain inlet and possibly clog the storm water box, even though we have storm drains being cleaned throughout the year some storm drain basins may require a cleaning sooner than others. If you happen to see any water pooling up outside of a storm drain inlet or manhole, please call the Public Works Department (Storm Water Coordinator) at (801)766-6506 ext. 172 to report any problems or concerns.

Always remember “Only Rain Down The Drain” and “Let’s Leave It Better Than The Way We Found It”.
