My Water Use Customer Portal



In 2014 the city took the first step to provide Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) to its citizens by adding water meters to the secondary water system. This began an ongoing effort to conserve water and assist citizens in understanding their water usage.

Since the implementation of this system secondary water usage has decreased by 35%-55%. Using grant funding we continued to establish Advanced Metering Infrastructure for the culinary and secondary water systems by installing smart meters, towers, and other AMI hardware throughout the city. Once that infrastructure was in place the city was able to provide the My Water Use Customer Portal to all of its citizens. This water portal allows citizens to see their water usage in real time.

They are able to set up a free account to see the hourly use, daily use, current year use and past historical use of their homes water

usage. In this system citizens are able to set up alerts such as leak alerts to quickly see if their system has an issue with continuously flowing water, water usage alerts to see if their system suddenly starts using more water than before, and vacation alerts to have the system send an email if there usage goes over a specified amount of water during a set period of time.

The alerts assist citizens in catching issues such as a system leak within a few days or even hours after the problem arises as opposed to in the past when they wouldn't realize there was an issue till their next bill came in the mail.

These cutting-edge efforts have been recognized by the Rural Water Association of Utah, which has awarded the City of Saratoga Springs the Outstanding Water Service to Customers Award for 2020. It will be accepted at the awards ceremony at their annual conference in March


Parking Vehicles On The Street

Spring Cleaning the Garage/Shed

It's starting to feel like spring again with the temperatures getting into the upper 50's. This means the garage needs to be gone through to remove those house hold items we have been

holding onto or acquired throughout the winter - it would be nice to fit your cars back into the garage.

With that in mind, you may find items such as cleaning detergents, antifreeze, used oils, old gasolines and other fluids or chemicals. If these items have been stored for a while and you're not using them, it may be a good time to get rid of them properly.

As a reminder, these items should never be dumped down a sink, a toilet, in the curb, or down a storm drain, as these all drain directly into our lake. If you find these items and just aren't quite sure what to do with them, please contact anyone

within our Public Works Department at (801)-766-6506 and we'll be happy to help with the proper education for disposal. You may also visit the Utah County Health Departments Website at www.utahcountyonline.org/dept/health/hhw/.

Remember: You can always dispose of household hazardous materials at either county waste station. (South Utah Valley Solid Waste District and/or North Pointe Solid Waste Special Service District.) Many items, such as paints, oil, gasoline, pesticides, and cleaners, have FREE disposal.

Ask A Question, Give Hope, Save a Life

If you think someone might be considering suicide - Ask Them! Asking does not make them more likely to attempt suicide and may actually save their life. If you or someone you know is at risk for suicide, take action immediately! Do not leave them alone.

- Call the Suicide Prevention Lifeline where confidential, non-judgmental and compassionate help is available 24/7: 1-800-273-TALK (8255) or Call 911.
- Take the person to the emergency room or seek help from a mental health

professional.

- Listen and tell them there is hope. It can be a great relief to someone in crisis when another person is willing to listen and talk with them about their thoughts.
- Do you have school-aged children? If so, download the SafeUT app to their phone and yours. Licensed clinicians provide 24/7 crisis intervention to youth through incoming chats, texts and calls by providing supportive or crisis counseling, suicide prevention,

and referral services. Parents and caregivers can utilize this app, as well.
