Under the direction of the City Council, Saratoga Springs has opened a new Passport Acceptance Facility. This is one of 7300 of these type of facilities located throughout the United States.

The role of a Passport Acceptance Facility is to accept a person's application and fees, verify their identity and citizenship, review their applications for completeness, and mail the completed applications to the Passport Agency for processing. You do not have to be a citizen of Saratoga Springs to use our passport office.

The Saratoga Springs Passport Office will be processing passports by appointment only. Patrons will need to make an appointment at least 24 hours in advance to use this service.

Here are some tips to help patron's appointments run smoothly.

Before coming to their appointment patrons need to make sure they have all of their documentation and the passport application

completely filled out. We encourage patrons to verify that they have all of the required documentation before coming to their appointment. A full list of what documentation you will need is available on the passport page of the city website.

Any appointment that does not have the application completely filled out or is missing the right documentation will be asked to make a new appointment to come back when they have the completed application and the correct documentation. Please be aware that all applicants, including children, must be present in person at the appointment.

The city is excited to be able to offer this service to our citizens. This will be a great resource to those that are wanting to travel outside of the country. Saratoga Springs MyWaterUse Portal

A new way to monitor your culinary and secondary water use is here! Sign up for the [MyWaterUse](#) portal and conveniently see how much your household uses and conserves.

Increased water use is inevitable in the warmer summer months. With the MyWaterUse portal, you can minimize your culinary and secondary water use and avoid paying higher fees. You can view your household's activity hourly from your desktop computer or mobile phone. Additionally, you can set up mobile alerts in the event of a sudden increase in water use or a potential leak.

Water conservation is especially important due to the State of Utah's dry climate. Saratoga Springs has made important strides over the last several years to conserve this precious resource. The Saratoga Springs Department of Public Utilities has recently made the transition to smart irrigation systems (weatherTRAK) to reduce overwatering. The MyWaterUse portal is another important step in the City's greater efforts to limit water consumption.

As we finish these jobs up, there is a proper place to dispose of all the green waste we have now accumulated.

I have been monitoring our foothills, and storm drain channels, along the shorelines of the Jordan River and the Utah Lake. I've been very disappointed to find multiple loads of garbage and green waste illegally being dumped in these areas.

I want our residents to understand

that just because it's green waste doesn't mean it's good for the environment, or that it's ok to dump it in these areas. It's like camping, the saying is "If you haul it in, you haul it out".

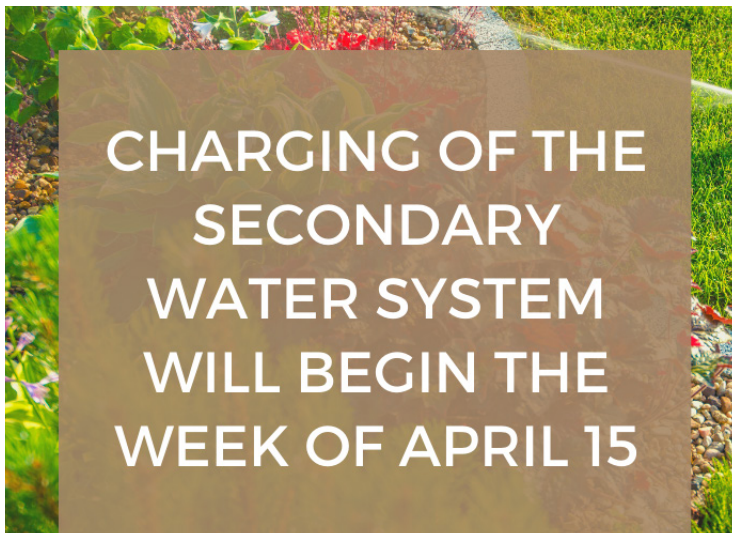
When you mow your lawn and you've decided to mulch your grass, just blow your clippings off of your driveways and sidewalks back into the grass. If you're going to bag lawn clippings, then you need to bag them and place them in your garbage can on garbage day.

Same goes for all of your limbs that you have trimmed off your trees; place them in your garbage can, and if your garbage can is full make a trip to the North Pointe Transfer station in Lindon.

They will accept all of your material as long as you have your loads tarped.

The dumping of any product in our foothills, any stormdrain channels or along any body of water is illegal and is a code enforcement violation. If caught, fines can be assessed up to \$1000 or more.

Let's keep our foothills, stormdrain channels, detention ponds and entire city beautiful for us all to enjoy walks, riding bikes, ATVs, horses etc. Also please remember "Only rain down the drain" and "Let's leave it better than we found it".
