

Using Water Wisely

Water is one of the most important resources we have in the State of Utah, and also one of the most limited. Utah is the second driest State in the Country yet it has one of the highest water usages per capita. On March 17 Governor Cox declared a state of emergency due to drought conditions.

"We've been monitoring drought conditions carefully and had hoped to see significant improvement from winter storms," said Gov. Cox. "Unfortunately, we have not received enough snow to offset the dry conditions. I ask Utahns to evaluate their water use and find ways to save not only because of current drought conditions but also because we live in one of the driest states in the nation."

It is important now more than ever that we evaluate our water usage and ensure that we are not overusing this valuable resource. The city is dedicated to conserving water. The Parks department is using smart irrigation systems (weatherTRAK) to water according to watering requirement needs.

This system has better control by being able to make adjustments with a central cloud based system. These systems also can monitor and track flow and send notifications on malfunctions in real time. This will shut off

damaged irrigation, and allows us to make timely repairs to avoid unnecessary water waste. When it comes to watering, we aim to water to the plant's needs. This is done by adequately keeping the root zone from reaching full depletion. There are many factors looked at when assessing water needs such as evapotranspiration, soil types, root depth, irrigation system efficiency, and slope.

Over the last year the city has promoted the My Water Use Customer Portal. This portal allows citizens to see hourly usage and set alerts that can help citizens catch issues sooner than they would have been able to in the past. With warmer weather here and people out walking with their dogs, please remember dogs are required to be on a physical leash at all times.

The Title 9 Animal Code states "It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to permit such dog to run at large." It also states "It shall be unlawful for the owner of a dog to permit such dog to go upon the private property of any person without the permission of the owner or person

entitled to possession of such private property whether the dog is on or off a leash."

It is also important to remember to be good neighbors and to clean up after your dog if needed while on your walk. Let's help ensure that all of our citizens are able to use our walking trails safely. Library Board Positions



Keeping Right of Ways Clear

of-way includes streets, sidewalks, curbs and gutters.

Materials should always be dumped in your driveway or yard so that storm water does not carry it away and into the City's storm drain inlets.

Not doing so can clog the inlets and prevent the storm water from properly draining, which may also cause flooding or overflow on the roads.

If you are not able to move material right away, place a tarp over the product to prevent storm water from carrying product into the storm drains.

As a good reminder, when purchasing materials to be delivered to your home, please take the time to prepare an area for the placement of the product. Also, make a plan to use it as quickly as possible so that it does not wash off your driveway and end up in the storm drain from rain or other weather.

Finally, please remember that storm water is not filtered, and that anything that runs down the gutters and streets eventually ends up in our rivers and lakes. Don't forget, "Only Rain Down The Drain" please, "Let's Leave It Better Than We Found It".
