

We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Drinking Water Quality Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality of the water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water.

We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources.

We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water sources have been determined to be from groundwater and surface water sources.

Our water sources are District Well 1, Well #2, Well #3, Well #4, and Well #6. We also purchase water from Central Utah WCD-Utah Valley (25112).

The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Saratoga Springs is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources and management strategies to protect our drinking water. Our sources are located in remote and protected areas and have a low level of susceptibility to potential contamination sources.

We have also developed management

strategies to further protect our sources from contamination. Please contact us if you have questions or concerns about our source protection plan.



## Careful In Our Landscaping

When Landscaping or beautifying your yard with delivered materials, whether it's bark, sand, decorative rock or gravel etc., these materials should never be dumped in any public right-of-way. The public right-of-way includes streets, sidewalks, curbs & gutters.

Materials should always be dumped in your Driveway or Yard so that storm water does not carry it away and into the City's storm drain inlets. There are many issues with materials being dumped on the curb or Right-Of-Way. This area is city property and is being used more frequently by vehicles and kids playing which elevates the issue of materials being a nuisance. Materials can cause a blind spot which could be dangerous for vehicles

and pedestrians. In addition if the materials are not cleaned up sufficiently, the hazard can cause a large liability. No one wants to have an accident while trying to get ordered landscaping material installed in their yard.

The material not properly dumped in the driveway creates more issues with our storm water drainage system, and it's directed towards our inlets, pipes & outfalls. Debris can clog inlets and prevent storm water from properly draining, which may also cause flooding or overflow on the roads.

If you are not able to move material right away, place a tarp over the product to prevent storm water from carrying product into storm drains, once again this is why the material

should ONLY be dumped in driveway.

As a good reminder when purchasing materials to be delivered to your home please take the time to talk to company delivering the materials and prepare an area for the placement of the product in your driveway. Also, make a plan to install your product as soon as possible so it does not wash off your driveway or right of way and end up in the storm drain.

Finally, please remember that storm water is not filtered, and that anything that runs down the gutters & streets eventually ends up in our rivers and lakes. Please Remember "Only Rain Down The Drain" please "Let's Leave It Better Than We Found It."

As your Fire Chief, **Effective Immediately!** I am implementing an **Aerial Fireworks Restriction** on both sides of the following streets in the City of Saratoga Springs. This is due to extreme fire conditions on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> of July 2021; and the 22<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of July 2021.
