Having a Fun, Safe Halloween

The Saratoga Springs Police Department wants to ensure all our residents have a safe Halloween this year. Trick or Treating can be a fun and exciting activity for all ages if done with a few safety precautions:

Costumes

- Use face paint instead of a mask as a mask can block vision.
- Wear light colored costumes or use reflective tape, stickers or glow sticks to help you be visible.
- Use a light colored candy bag for better visibility.
- Wear shoes that fit to avoid tripping or falling.
- Ensure your costume isn't too long to create a tripping hazard.

Driving

- Don't drink alcohol or use drugs and then drive. We need our streets as safe as possible on Halloween night!
- SLOW DOWN and watch for kids.
- If you're driving children around for trick-or-treating, make sure everyone is buckled up appropriately in a car seat, booster or seat belt. Do this every time they enter the car, and check to make sure they're secure before driving to the next stop.

- Put your cell phone down and don't use any other mobile device while driving. Pull over to safely check voice messages or texts if necessary.
- Be especially alert for trick-or-treaters during the popular trick-or-treating hours of 5:30 - 9:30pm.

Walking

- Trick or Treaters under age 12 should be accompanied by an adult.
- Trick or treat in familiar and well lit areas.
- Kids should never enter any house without an adult.
- Cross the street at intersections using crosswalks where possible.

Treats

- Parents should inspect all candy before children eat any.
- All opened or tampered with treats should be thrown away.

If you see anything suspicious during your celebrations please call 801-794-3970. By taking a few precautions we can ensure that all of the kids in our community have a fun, safe Halloween.



2021 Municipal General Election

November 2, 2021



The City of Saratoga Springs will hold elections for the offices of Mayor and City Council (2 seats).

Need to Know:


- Ballots will be mailed to registered voters the week of October 11. If a voter does not have a ballot by October 18, they should contact the County Elections Office at 801-851-8128.



- Ballots may be returned to any of the secured Ballot Drop Boxes located throughout Utah County. A drive-up Drop Box is located in the north area of the parking lot at the Saratoga Springs City offices, 1307 N. Commerce Drive.
- If returning your ballot by mail the deadline for a postmark is November 1, the day before Election Day.
- Voter Registration deadline is October 22. You will need to re-register to vote if you have moved to a new address, changed your name or you wish to change your party affiliation.
- Election Day Polling Locations will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM on Election Day and Utah laws permitting same-day registration via provisional ballots will be in effect.
- Early in-person voting is available on Oct. 27 – Nov. 1, at the Utah County Elections Office (100 E. Center St. Provo).



It's that time of year when we start cleaning up the garage to make room for our cars before the first snow starts falling. With that in mind, you may find items such as cleaning detergents,

antifreeze, used oils, old gasoline and other fluids or chemicals.

If these items have been stored for a while and you're not using them, it may be time to get rid of them properly. As a reminder, these hazardous items should not be dumped down a sink, a toilet, in the curb or down a storm drain, as these all lead directly into our lakes and/or streams.

If you find these types of items and aren't quite sure what to do with

them, please contact D. Brown with our Storm Water Division within our Public Works Department at 801-766-6506 and we'll be happy to help with your disposal.

How 911 Helps Us Help You

For those of you who are blessed to not have ever dialed those three magic numbers 911; and for those that unfortunately have, please allow me to explain about the process.

We are fortunate enough to have an automated dispatch system on the Fire & EMS side of things. This means once your phone call and address are confirmed, the necessary emergency vehicles are being pulled up and dispatched by the automated dispatch system. Often we receive the dispatch call while you are still on the phone with the dispatch center answering a list of very

designed questions.

The line of questions you may be asked, or were asked, are specific to the issue(s) being presented to the dispatcher by the caller. The dispatchers utilize a very effective questioning system called "Pro - QA" This is an industry-wide program that helps narrow down issue(s) that someone may be having, allowing responders to begin to focus in on the need of the patient(s) prior to arrival.

The process utilizes technology available to dispatch, such as satellite GPS, and cell phone pings to help us locate a caller. We update our system

with new streets that are being built at record pace monthly with dispatch. No system is perfect, but it is the best system ever provided to Police and Fire in the region. The line of questioning you may be asked should you ever need the 911 system, may

seem aggravating at the time. However, please know we understand OUR system is all about time, and answering the questions allow us to respond with the appropriate emergency services. We strive to reduce time at every turn.

It is a pleasure to serve all of you, our customers, with the care and compassion you expect and deserve. We take "time" very seriously and measure all aspects of our responses to you when called.
