# 2021 Municipal General Election

November 2, 2021



The City of Saratoga Springs will hold elections for the offices of Mayor and City Council (2 seats).

Information on candidates may be found at [Vote.Utah.Gov](http://Vote.Utah.Gov).

## Need to Know:

- Ballots will be mailed to registered voters the week of October 11. If a voter does not have a ballot by October 18, they should contact the County Elections Office at 801-851-8128.
- Ballots may be returned to any of the secured Ballot Drop Boxes located throughout Utah County. A drive-up Drop Box is located in the north area of the parking lot at the Saratoga Springs City offices, 1307 N. Commerce Drive.
- If returning your ballot by mail the deadline for a postmark is November 1, the day before Election Day.
- Election Day Polling Locations will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM on Election Day and Utah laws permitting same-day registration via provisional ballots will be in effect.

## Illegal Dumping Affects Us All

Fall is officially here! Trees are losing their leaves and many home owners are making those final cuts on their lawns, as well as the city shutting off the secondary water so we can purge air throughout our irrigation systems and have the freeze protection for the cold winter months ahead.

We have noticed an increase of illegal dumping in our open spaces including vacant lots, storm water drainage canals, foothills and along the shoreline of Utah Lake. The Storm Water Division would like

to remind residents that these are privately owned properties and the dumping of your waste (including green waste) is illegal and has the potential to infest our lakes and waterways with unwanted debris.

In addition, dumping of mattresses, box springs, old furniture, appliances and garbage is strictly prohibited. Please be aware that we are watching these areas closely and fines are being imposed if you are caught dumping day or night. If you see anyone dumping in these areas please contact the Public Works offices

immediately.

There are many local dumps for your convenience such as the North Pointe Transfer Station, in Pleasant Grove as well as the International Regional Landfill in Fairfield (please make sure your loads are tarped and or secured when transporting to proper locations).

Help us keep our city and communities beautiful and our waterways clean! Let's continue to do our part and leave it better than the way we found it. Please Remember "Only Rain Down The Drain"

# Snow Removal & Winter Parking

During the winter months, the City's goal is to keep the streets safe for travel. The City is responsible for more than 90 miles of road, equating to about 180 miles of plowing.

With the snow season creeping up on us we wanted to reach out and let the public know the rules about parking vehicles on the street during the winter months.

Under City Code 19.18.10, Parking During Snow Removal From Streets, it reads, "It is illegal for the owner or driver of any vehicle to park, cause, or allow to be parked such vehicle upon a City street or right-of-way during a snowstorm

when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, or following a snowstorm when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, and the City's snow removal equipment has not yet been utilized to remove the snow."

The Streets Department has also asked that all portable basketball stands are removed off of the roadways, and that residents verify that any trees that overhang the roadway are pruned to the proper height to allow snow plows to traverse the road unimpeded.

City crews conduct snow removal and road salting operations around the clock, if necessary, during winter storms. In order to achieve this, the City has a prioritized sequence in which the roads will be plowed and salted.

Residents are reminded not to park vehicles on roadways during or immediately after a snowstorm to allow snow plows to clear roadways.
