Saratoga Springs Police Department Citizens Acadamy

Shooting guns, traffic stops, crime scenes, and blood splatter might sound like a TV show plot line but it also describes the Saratoga Springs Police Department's citizen academy classes. Citizens are given the opportunity to do these and many other hands-on educational opportunities.

This program, held annually in the fall, is meant to give citizens a chance to learn what officers do on a day to day basis as well as allow citizens to ask questions they might have in reference to officers' jobs. It is a free nine week academy offered to any citizen age 21 and up living in Saratoga Springs or Bluffdale Cities. Classes are held at the Public Safety Community Room one evening a week.

Something the police department added to the curriculum this year was the Virtra simulator. Citizens were put into virtual police situations and had to decide how to diffuse them. A graduate said "The simulator class that was held at Lehi

is unforgettable and a huge paradigm shift for me. The precarious nature of those situations has given me a huge appreciation for the men and women willing to engage in them."



SHOVELING YOUR WALKS, DRIVES & MORE

- Property owners are responsible for keeping all sidewalks along their property free of snow and ice.
- It is important to keep the area around fire hydrants free of snow.
 - it is the home owners' responsibility to clear snow from around fire hydrants in front of their home.
- State law prohibits residents from depositing snow onto city streets.
 - Snow removed from driveways and sidewalks should be shoveled onto lawns or park strip areas and not onto public streets.

The Right Way to Clear Snow off of Walkways

Saratoga Springs continues to welcome new residents from all over. Some are seeing snow for the first time in their lives and have reached out to our offices asking what is the proper way of removing snow from their sidewalks, driveways and walkways.

When shoveling or using a snow blower remember all snow must be directed & kept on your own property. The snow cannot be pushed, shoveled or blown into the city roadways or neighboring properties and must stay within your property boundaries. Also, please remember to use as little salt or de-icer as possible to prevent

any additional contaminated runoff.

Keep in mind that we have miles of roadways to clear quickly to keep residents as safe as possible and we are again reminding everyone to please remove vehicles, basketball stands, garbage/recycling cans and any other items from the street during a storm as soon as possible so we can do our jobs safely and in a timely manner. As you can imagine, it's very frustrating for snow plow crews to effectively clean your streets when they are not clear. Please help us help you!
