Using Water Wisely

Water is one of the most important resources we have in the state of Utah, and also one of the most limited. Utah is the second driest state in the country, yet has one of the highest water usages per capita.

It is important now more than ever that we evaluate our water usage and ensure that we are not overusing this valuable resource. The city is dedicated to conserving water. Over past years the Parks Department has been switching sprinkler systems in city facilities to a smart irrigation system (weatherTRAK) to water according to watering requirement needs.

This system allows us better control of the irrigation systems at city facilities by being able to make adjustments with a central cloud-based system. These systems can also monitor and track flow, and send notifications on malfunctions in real time. This will shut off damaged irrigation, and allows us to make timely repairs to avoid unnecessary water waste.

The Parks Department will continue to perform comprehensive maintenance of the irrigation systems in city facilities to ensure they run as efficiently as possible limiting water waste. They will maintain turf in recreation fields and other high-use areas while allowing grasses in spaces not used for recreation programming to stress and possibly go dormant. With the

cutback of irrigation in non-high use areas, they will increase broadleaf weed control to minimize weeds in areas allowed to enter a state of stress.

The city has led out in water conservation in the state of Utah by adding meters to irrigation systems. This has helped our residents better see the amount of water being used for irrigation, decreasing the amount of water used by residents by 60% between 2015 (when the meters were installed) and 2020.

Residents can use the My Water Use Customer Portal to see hourly water usage in both their culinary and irrigation systems. They can set alerts for increase in water usage to catch issues quickly to minimize water waste. To access the My Water Use Customer Portal and other water conservation resources, residents can go to the Water Conservation Page on the city website - www.saratogaspringscity.com/conservewater

Remember, the Department of Natural Resources is encouraging residents to not water established grasses and plants until average temperatures are in the mid 70s for several consecutive days. Working together we can continue to conserve water for our future and ensure that Saratoga Springs continues to be a great place to live, work and play.

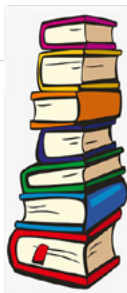

Keeping Right of Ways Clear

When landscaping or beautifying your yard with delivered materials, whether it's bark, sand, decorative rock, gravel etc., those materials should never be dumped in any public right-of-way. The public right-

of-way includes streets, sidewalks, curbs and gutters.

Materials should always be dumped in your driveway or yard so that storm water does not carry it away and into the City's storm drain inlets.

Not doing so can clog the inlets and prevent the storm water from properly draining, which may also cause flooding or overflow on the roads.

If you are not able to move material right away, place a tarp over the product to prevent storm water from carrying the product into the storm drains.

As a good reminder, when purchasing materials to be delivered to your home, please take the time to prepare an area for the placement of the product. Also, make a plan to use it as quickly as possible so that it does not wash off your driveway and end up in the storm drain from rain or other weather.

Finally, please remember that storm water is not filtered, and that anything that runs down the gutters and streets eventually ends up in our rivers and lakes. Don't forget, "Only Rain Down The Drain" and please, "Let's Leave It Better Than We Found It".

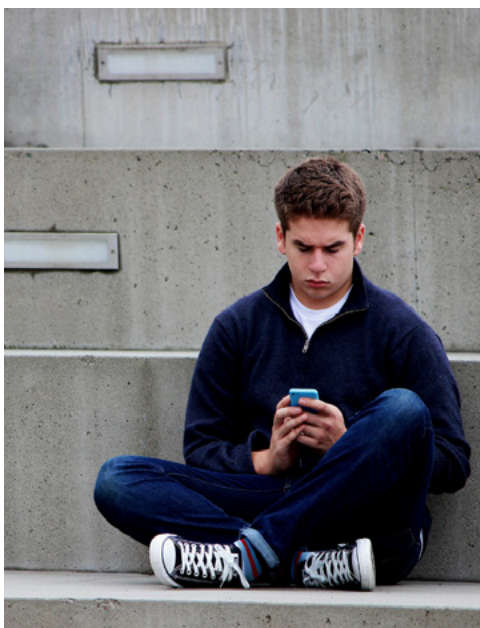
