

something careless that may allow wildland history to be repeated.

AERIAL FIREWORK RESTRICTIONS!!

Dear Constituents,

As your Fire Chief, **Effective Immediately!** I am implementing an **Aerial Fireworks Restriction** on both sides of the following streets in the City of Saratoga Springs. This is due to extreme fire conditions on the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th of July 2022; and the 22nd, 23rd, 24th and 25th of July 2022.

Also, should you be found to be responsible for the starting of a fire, any and all costs of that suppression effort will be borne by the responsible party.

Water Saving Tips!

- Use the Irrigation Calculator to see how much water your lawn really needs
- Sign up for the My Water Use Customer Portal to keep track of usage and set up alerts to catch issues sooner
- Mow less frequently and with a higher mower blade to reduce stress to your lawn
- Irrigate at night or early morning to avoid evaporation loss. Do not irrigate between 10 AM – 6 PM
- Check sprinkler heads to verify they are in good condition and working properly
- Check for overspray; change sprinkler heads where possible to minimize overspray on sidewalks and roads
- Only water every three days

A Letter From The Director

Our staff have done incredible things, such as completely pivoting to drive-up only services with just one day of closure when the pandemic started, creating take-home craft and STEAM kits, running fun and interactive in-person and virtual programs, and more. Time after time they've surprised and inspired me with their willingness to serve, modify services, and experiment.

Our staff really are amazing and passionate about the services they offer! We look forward to continuing to serve you; however, due to many factors, some changes are going to be made to some of our hours, policies, and services.

We're making some changes to our business hours posted to the right. The Saratoga Springs Public Library is experiencing the same staff shortages many businesses are experiencing, and we need to make adjustments to our open hours. After reviewing the data for visitors per hour over the last 5 years, we found that the two hours on Friday and Saturday from 4 PM to 6 PM are the slowest. Reducing our hours by closing at 4 PM on those days will align our business hours with nearby libraries, while allowing us to have additional staff available during our busiest hours.

Additionally, we've been experiencing an increase in theft from the library, which makes us sad—everything checks out for free. We just ask that you return it on time, with all of its parts, and in the same condition it was when you took it home. If you do have something that was not checked out, please return it in the outside drop or to the library's front desk, no questions asked.

However - due to these issues,

we are turning our emergency exit door security alarms back on and the library will be discontinuing drive up service beginning Friday, July 1, 2022.

Effective July 1, 2022 the amounts for fines on overdue items are changing.

- Audio Books, Books, and Kits will be \$0.25 per day per item.
- DVDs and Video Games will be \$0.50 per day per item.
- Equipment, Launchpads, Library of Things, and Recreation Equipment will be \$0.75 per day per item.

Your library account will still be opted in to automatic renewal (unless you've logged in and opted out of this feature). This will renew any items that do not have holds placed on them, which will help prevent overdue fines from even happening. Make sure to watch your inbox and/or to mark library@saratogaspringscity.com as a safe sender (or white list it).

To help decrease wait times for popular items, the following two policies will be implemented. (You can view these policies in the Service & Circulation policy on our website.) The policies are: (1) Holds will only be held for 4 business days from when they arrived; (2) Customers with an overdue item will no longer be able to check out additional items.

All programming has been brought back into the building, courtesy of the City Council allowing us to use their chambers. Ms. Taffi, Mr. Carl, Ms. Anna and Ms. Jenean have spent several months planning wonderful things for summer. We also have a few amazing volunteers who have started up a Knit Wits program and Table Top games groups.

fireworks, family parties, and yard cleanup projects. The City of Saratoga Springs would like to remind all residents of the role they play in keeping our gutters and storm drain systems clean.

The City's storm drain system consists of complex pipe networks and treatment devices. Clogs in these systems can have devastating effects. It doesn't take long for leaves, grass clippings, dirt, and debris to clog our storm inlets and catch basins. This is where you can help.

We invite all our residents to help by sweeping or blowing grass clippings back onto your property, rather than sweeping or

blowing them out into the streets and gutters. These practices not only improve stormwater flow capacity but also reduce contaminants that enter our lakes and rivers.

A clean stormwater system is crucial to not only mitigating flooding in our neighborhoods and roadways, but also in keeping our rivers and lakes clean. Sweeping out the gutter in front of your house can improve stormwater flows and improve your community's overall appearance. Please help by doing your part, and let's have a clean and safe summer.




