Snow Removal and Winter Parking

During the winter months, the City's goal is to keep the streets safe for travel. The City is responsible for more than 90 miles of road, equating to about 180 miles of plowing.

With the snow season creeping up on us we wanted to reach out and let the public know the rules about parking vehicles on the street during the winter months.

Under City Code 19.18.10, Parking During Snow Removal From Streets, it reads, "It is illegal for the owner or driver of any vehicle to park, cause, or allow to be parked such vehicle upon a City street or right-of-way during a snowstorm when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, or following a snowstorm when a measurable amount of snow has fallen, and the City's snow removal equipment has not yet been utilized to remove the snow."

The Streets Department has also asked

that all portable basketball stands are removed off of roadways, and that residents verify that any trees that overhang the roadway are pruned to the proper height to allow snow plows to traverse the road unimpeded.

City crews conduct snow removal and road salting operations around the clock, if necessary, during winter storms. In order to achieve this, the City has a prioritized sequence in which the roads will be plowed and salted.

Residents are reminded not to park vehicles on roadways during or immediately after a snowstorm to allow snow plows to clear roadways.

6 Reasons To Move Your Car Off The Street When It Snows

- It is the law.
- If enough cars are parked along a road they could prevent access to snowplows.
- Cars parked along a road that can be accessed by a snowplow limit the clearing area of the snow plow as the driver maneuvers around parked vehicles.
- Maneuvering around vehicles takes extra time which limits how quickly roads can be cleared.
- Cars moved after a road has been cleared can leave large piles of snow in the road.
- Snow left in the road can limit road access to vehicles including public safety vehicles, garbage collection trucks and more.



Preparing for Winter

The City of Saratoga Springs would like to remind our residents of the efforts we take in preparing for the changing of the seasons. In preparation for winter, the Parks Division will be performing the final lawn maintenance, the Water Division will be draining the secondary water system, and our Streets Division will begin the fall sweeping program. Residents will also be doing similar winter preparations on their own properties.

As you conduct your own winter preparations, please remember to keep grass

clippings and leaves from entering the storm drain system. Bag and dispose of them in the proper waste containers. Sweep or blow clippings onto your lawn, and not into the street. If you have debris in front of your home, please sweep it out of the curb and gutter then discard it properly.

If you find filter bags or drain protection around inlets in your neighborhood, do not remove or disturb these devices, as they are set up for construction activity and runoff protection in your area. If you identify

potential problems with any of these, please report your concern to the Public Works Department at 801-766-9793 ext. 279.

Remember, the small efforts of many can and do make a BIG difference for all of us. Thank you for your continued efforts in keeping our waterways clean and clear.
