Sometimes the holiday hustle and bustle



If a holiday (only those shown above on calendar) falls on a weekday, service will be delayed one day following the holiday. 

Winter Storm Drain Protection

The winter months can be long and cold. With the amount of snow we receive here in Saratoga Springs, the city streets are plowed and salted to ensure safe travel for all residents. The quantity of salt that is spread on our streets is actually applied within a narrow range. Too little salt is ineffective, but too much salt can have the reverse effect as well.

In fact, Olympic Ski Racing venues actually apply salt to the snow on the ski race trail when conditions are soft to firm and harden the course. Additionally, too much salt can adversely affect aquatic life in our lakes and streams. It can also irritate the paws

of your pets at home, and certain chemical combinations can deteriorate the surface of your concrete driveway as well. With that in mind, it is important to monitor how much salt and deicer is spread on your driveways and walkways this winter.

When snow melt makes its way into and through the storm drain system, it collects and carries dissolved salt and deicers to our streams, rivers, and lakes. To help protect these waterways, which include Utah Lake, here are a few things you can do this winter: shovel or snow blow the accumulated snow on hard surfaces and lightly lay down your salt & deicer. It's always a good practice to

put down a small amount, and if needed use a little more to keep your driveways and sidewalks free of ice.

Remember that most of what is applied will ultimately end up unfiltered in our rivers and lakes, so please, "Only Rain Down the Drain", and let's leave it better than the way we found it.
