

Springtime Helpful Habits

Spring is here, and with that comes new challenges. The City is grateful for all the runoff that has drained throughout our City so efficiently these past months. However, it is time to prepare the City to turn on our pressurized irrigation systems. Here are a few things to be mindful of this irrigation season:

- When the pressurized irrigation system is turned on, remember to check the sprinkler systems around your property. Utah's long winter seasons have been known to cause damage to pipes and valves, so please check your systems thoroughly.
- As you repair and adjust your sprinkler systems, adjust your sprinklers

so the water is focused on your grass and yard areas only. Over-spray that ends up in the street can add to the demands of the City's storm drain system.

- Use your best judgment when setting your sprinkler timers. Typically early morning or mid-dusk helps in mitigating evaporation rates and gives you the most out of your system.
- Be up-to-date with local irrigation watering restrictions that may be in place. For more information visit our website at www.saratogaspringscity.com/waterconservation.
- Last but not least, when fertilizing your yard make sure you keep fertilizer on your grass. Sweeping granules back into

your grassy area will not hurt your lawn. This practice ultimately helps stop the transport of fertilizer from reaching our rivers and lakes.

If we all do our part in keeping our sprinkler systems running efficiently as possible, we can help take pressure off our storm drain systems when it is not needed. Remember these factors as we transition from season to season, and remember, "only rain down the storm drain".
