What Is Allowed In The Stormdrain

With the weather turning the corner to warmer temperatures, our outdoor activities increase. As we spend more time outside working in the yard, or just soaking up the sun, we could all use a reminder about what can and can't

be put in the stormdrain. For more comprehensive information, please refer City Code 18.06.08.2.a, which is available for download on the city website. www.saratogaspringscity.com

In summary, only uncontaminated discharges of water are allowed to go down the storm drain. In short, if it is a solid, then it is not allowed. If it has a chemical or detergent in it, then it is not allowed. Thus, grass clippings, weeds, tree trimmings, leaves, and automobile fluids (oil, gas, antifreeze) are all examples of prohibited discharges.

Rain runoff from your roof that flows down your gutters, driveway, and

into the curb and gutter is an example of an acceptable discharge. When in doubt, please err on the conservative side. Ultimately, this system drains directly into the Jordan River or Utah Lake, and is only intended to convey water that comes from storms.

In short, if it didn't fall from the sky as precipitation, then it needs to be discharged elsewhere. It is important to note that first aid is not a substitute for professional medical care. However, being knowledgeable and prepared can help to reduce the severity of

an injury or illness and can also help to calm and reassure those affected by the emergency. By prioritizing first aid as a key element of emergency preparedness, we can increase our chances of surviving and recovering from emergencies and disasters.
