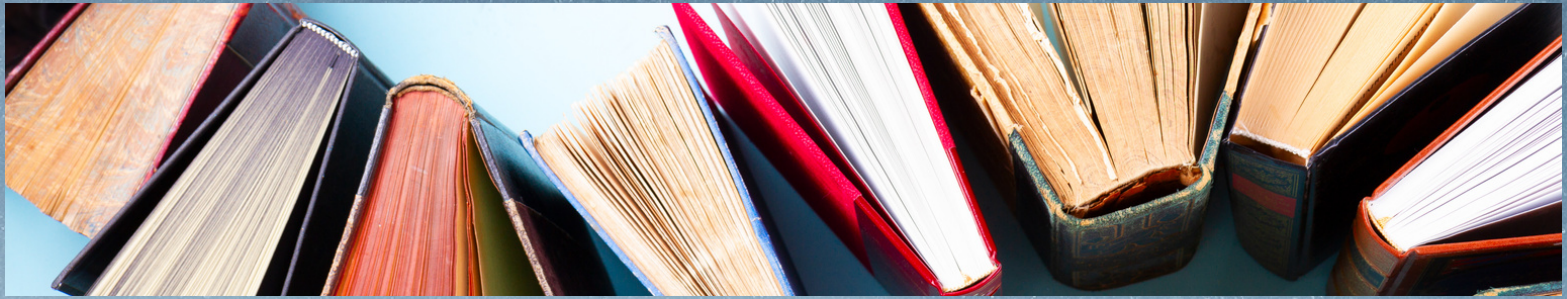


SARATOGA SPRINGS PUBLIC LIBRARY NEWSLETTER

Q: Do you accept donations?

A: Our space is very limited, and at the moment we do not have the ability to retain items that are not frequently used. We do accept some donations. Please be sure that what you are donating has been published in the last 5 years, is in like new condition, and if it is more than one box, that you have an appointment to drop them off. Please also be aware that not all donations will be added to the library and, once received, they become our property to distribute as we need to.

Fun fact: A library serving a city of our size should spend a minimum of 6% of its budget on building its collections; we spend nearly 15% of our budget purchasing new items.

HOW-TO SECTION**Place items in the cart and put them on hold**

1. Visit www.saratogaspringscity.com/library.
2. Click on the 'Catalog & Log Into Your Account' link and log in.
 - a. Hint: if you don't remember your PIN, try the last four digits of your card number.
3. Browse and search for items any way you like. Searching can be done by ISBN, Title, Author, Subject and more.
4. Select the Check Box in front of the items you want, and at the top "With selected titles:" select the drop down and choose "Cart".
5. Your cart is available in the top tool bar when you are logged into your account.
 - a. Once your cart is full, or you've searched for the items you wish to place on hold, click on the cart in the toolbar to review your cart.
 - b. Select the items you would like to place on hold from this list and click "Place Hold".
6. This will open your confirmation in another screen where you need to click "Confirm Hold." The software will list for you the number of holds on that title and your place in the holds queue.

~ Holds can sometimes take a couple hours to pull and might not always be available. You can check your hold status online, or wait for an email to arrive notifying you of your hold availability.

~ Library cards are limited to 30 holds at a time, so choose wisely; also remember, we can only hold books for 4 days once they're waiting for you, then they go to the next person in line!

Love! But as I'm getting older I am realizing I cannot ride as many as I'd like to...


What do you love most about working in the library?

A FAREWELL to ARMS

The best American novel to emerge from World War I, *A Farewell to Arms* is the unforgettable story of an American ambulance driver on the Italian front and his passion for a beautiful English nurse. Hemingway's frank portrayal of the love between Lieutenant Henry and Catherine Barkley, caught in the inexorable sweep of war, glows with an intensity unrivaled in modern literature, while his description of the German attack on Caporetto—of lines of tired men marching in the rain, hungry, weary, and demoralized—is one of the greatest moments in literary history. A story of love and pain, of loyalty and desertion, *A Farewell to Arms*, written when he was thirty years old, represents a new romanticism for Hemingway.

The numbers under the "recertification" column are ours, and the numbers under the "10th percentile" column are the minimum service level recommendations for a library serving a population of our city's size.

Why is this important?

Being certified allows us access to State and Federal grants and resources - which, in turn, enables us to better serve you. To certify, we are required to meet 7 out of the 12 metrics at the minimum level indicated.

Please note the categories we exceed the requirements (such as our circulation and turnover rates, or number of programs) and the categories in which we fall short of the minimum requirements for our population size (staff, budget).



Early literacy at home



Literacy isn't just reading!

What are narrative skills, and why are they important ?

Narrative skills are what we show when describing things and events, telling stories, knowing the order of events, and making predictions. When children can describe something or retell stories, it shows that they are comprehending what they are reading; this is crucial to helping them stay motivated to keep reading.



Remember: there is no app to replace your lap!

What Can You Do to Help Build This Skill?

- ~ Ask open-ended questions that encourage conversations, rather than yes/no or right/wrong answers.
- ~ Talk about your day and its series of events.
- ~ Mix up the events in a story; make it silly!
- ~ Guess what comes next - or come up with a different ending.
- ~ Read stories without words; they really help focus on this skill.
- ~ Name objects, feelings, and events.
