Temporary Signs

Temporary signs, as a broad category encompass a wide range of signage, serving various purposes. While political signs fall under this umbrella, it's crucial to acknowledge the diversity in their applications and significance.

In a general context, temporary signs include promotional banners, garage sales, event announcements, real estate advertisements, construction notifications, and many others. Unlike political signs, specifically designed for election campaigns, temporary signs serve a different group as versatile tools for conveying temporary information. They often feature eye-catching graphics and concise messages to capture attention, catering to a wide array of informational needs.

These signs, often made of lightweight materials like corrugated plastic, are cost-effective and portable, making them popular for political and advertising campaigns.

They are strategically placed in high-visibility areas such as busy intersections, public spaces, and major roadways to maximize reach and influence. The goal is to ensure that the message is seen by as many people as possible, increasing name recognition and fostering a sense of familiarity.

Political signs, a subset of temporary signs, are exclusively devoted to political campaigns, aiming to promote candidates, convey their messages, and generate public support during elections. Typically bearing the names, slogans, and party affiliations of candidates, political signs allow voters to identify and align with their preferred choices.

Temporary signs can be placed on private residential property behind the sidewalk, with the owner's permission without first obtaining a City permit, assuming the signage meets the requirements of City code. *continued on page 4*

Pressurized Irrigation Water Sources

Temporary Signs Cont.

Commercial properties are also allowed temporary signage with the owner's permission and after first obtaining a City permit. This practice allows individuals or organizations to express opinions, promote events, or display information on residential or commercial premises while protecting

the rights of all property owners.

However, all temporary signs regardless of content are subject to regulations and guidelines regarding placement in public areas. The City has established rules regarding placement, size, quantity, and duration to increase safety, reduce clutter, and prevent

disturbing City utilities and required signage. Violations may result in fines and removal of signs.


To Prepare:

Preparing For Spring Run-Off

Utah's weather can be unpredictable. It is not uncommon for Mother Nature to present conditions that may cause concerns for residents here in the City of Saratoga Springs. To help address some

flooding concerns, the City's Public Works Department has been out inspecting and maintaining the storm drain system throughout our City.

In preparation for the spring run-off season, please take a few minutes to look around your own property and assess how you can prepare for this spring run-off season as well.

It is a good idea to secure outdoor furniture, trash cans, along with clearing leaves and debris from in front of your property. Please sweep leaves or debris

out of the gutters and place them into a garbage can so they do not end up in the storm drain system.

The City is proud of our storm drain system as it has proven to mitigate flooding while moving storm water through our watershed. If you have any concerns about storm drains that may need to be serviced, please contact the Public Works Department at (801) 766-6506. Together we can prepare for the runoff season, while also protecting the environment we love.

Emergency Preparedness Hygiene & Sanitation



The second emergency after an initial disaster is disease outbreak. Improper hygiene and sanitation lead to deadly diseases like typhoid, dysentery, and cholera. Prevent disease and illness by keeping yourself and your surrounding environment clean.

Having a storage of hygiene and sanitation supplies and knowing how to safely use them at home and away is vital for you and your family to "be ready" for survival. Gather emergency sanitation supplies including at least one month or more of toilet paper, feminine hygiene as needed, hand sanitizer, paper towels, garbage bags, and cleaning supplies.

- Add hygiene and sanitation

supplies to your disaster supply kit.

- Create a hand washing station and add it to your emergency supplies.
- Create a "port-a-potty" kit (second page) and add it to your emergency supplies.
- Gather supplies for doing laundry and dishes by hand. Teach household members how.
- Add hygiene and sanitation supplies to work and school emergency kits.
- Check with your local municipality on what local plans and regulations are in place for local disposal of garbage and human waste in the event of an emergency.
- BONUS: Practice proper outdoor hygiene and sanitation by going camping. Learn how to safely create and use a latrine
