Community Development Update

A new Downtown Plan was recently approved which sets the framework and vision for the development of something Saratoga Springs has been missing: a

Downtown. The development area is located between Pioneer Crossing and Mountain View Boulevard. Build out of this area will likely take many years, and the plan is at this point conceptual and subject to change. The plan can be viewed on the City website at www.saratogasprings-ut.gov.

In recent years, the Community Development Department has sponsored public events known as "Breakfast with Planners", where residents can get updates to current projects and ask questions regarding community planning. A regular feature is the Ask-a-

Planner discussion, where many questions are answered, such as:

"What will be included in the new Downtown? What new trails are being planned? What new commercial projects are in the works? What is the City's plan for allowing high density residential development? Can we stop or slow down development? What's the plan for new city facilities, such as the new Library/City Hall, parks and recreation? What's the plan for new and expanded roadways?"

If you have similar questions, the next planning outreach event will be held in October.

Protecting Storm Drains From Oil Spills

Living so close to Utah Lake and the Jordan River creates a unique opportunity for residents of Saratoga Springs to become more aware of the importance of


protecting the storm drains from oil spills. If the oil reaches the storm drains it will get washed into the Jordan River or Utah Lake. Adding pollutants to these bodies of water harms the environment. Ensuring we can act fast to clean up oil spills is very important. If there is an oil spill, you should first protect the storm drains so it doesn't get contaminated. Here is a list of supplies you can use to clean up oil spills.

- Oil Dry

- Cat Litter
- Saw Dust

Once you have one of these materials you will apply generously onto the oil spill. Pushing the material around is important to ensure it soaks up all the oil. When the oil is all soaked up, put the material into a container and dispose of it properly. The City of Saratoga Springs appreciates everyone's help keeping our waters clean.

Emergency Preparedness Light & Power



Emergency lighting is necessary for safety and for emotional and mental health. Light helps you see and avoid hazards. It can help you better see and understand your situation when a disaster happens. Have you ever been in a cave with absolutely no light? It can be disorienting at the very least.

Power outages are very common, especially during emergencies and disasters. Knowing what to do in a power outage situation can help you "Be Ready" for your own safety and the safety of others.

*Add electrical power and natural gas company phone numbers in your emergency contacts.

*Put flashlights, batteries, and chemical glow sticks in emergency kits.

*Store batteries in original packaging – not in flashlights, radios, or other electronic devices.

*Learn how to safely shut-off all of the utilities at your home and

teach all responsible people how and when to do the same.

*Store a gas shut-off wrench near your outside gas meter.

*Have emergency chargers for mobile phones and other emergency communication equipment.

*Get power back-ups if someone uses life-saving electronic medical equipment.

*Install safety lighting where needed around your home.
