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State Greenlights \$1.4 Billion in New UDOT Projects in Northern Utah County

The Utah Transportation Commission has greenlit an ambitious slate of new transportation projects totaling nearly \$1.4 billion for northwest Utah County. The funding will help the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) build two new freeways and a freeway extension. This new funding, combined with previously approved projects, represents a \$2.1 billion investment into this area through the end of the decade. Among the key new projects approved are:

- Conversion of 2100 North to a freeway in Lehi: \$554 million (including \$275 in new funding): This project will extend the freeway connection along 2100 North between Mountain View Corridor and I-15, and will help improve east-west mobility between the two freeways in northwest Utah and Salt Lake Counties and help to disperse traffic more efficiently for drivers traveling to communities within the central Utah Valley area. The project will also connect existing and planned trails in the area to help people to get to their destinations and provide easier access through communities. Construction is expected to start in 2026.

- Pioneer Crossing Flex Lanes: \$77 million: This project would provide two additional travel lanes in the peak direction of travel depending on the time of day (just like 5400 South in Salt Lake County). The project would also re-stripe Pioneer Crossing from Redwood Road to MVC to provide one additional travel lane in each direction throughout the day. Most work is expected to be completed within the existing state right of way. Construction is expected to start as early as 2025 or 2026.

- Extension of Mountain View Corridor South to Cory Wride Hwy (SR-73): \$553 million: This project will extend Mountain View Corridor to Cory Wride Hwy (SR-73) in Saratoga Springs. It will help reduce congestion on Redwood Road and I-15 around the Point of the Mountain by providing an alternative freeway connection for traffic traveling between northwest Utah County and Salt Lake County. The project will also include trails and trail connections to provide Utahn more choices for their travel. Construction is expected to start as early as 2027.

- Cory Wride Freeway (SR-73) From Mountain View Corridor to Ranches Parkway: \$459 million: This project will construct a new freeway with frontage roads from Mountain View Corridor to Ranches Parkway in Eagle Mountain. The project will ease congestion in the area, accommodate transit, bike lane and trail improvements, minimize impacts to existing properties and preserve access to existing developments. Construction is expected to start as early as 2027.

These new projects represent the state's biggest transportation investment in Utah County since the I-15 CORE project wrapped in 2012. That project reconstructed 24 miles of freeway from Lehi to Spanish Fork. These new projects underscore the Utah State Legislature's substantial commitment to bolstering transportation infrastructure in northwest Utah County.

Notice of Approval of Enterprise Fund Transfers in the Final Budget for fiscal year 2024-2025

In accordance with Utah Code § 10-6-135.5, Notice is hereby given that the City of Saratoga Springs City Council has adopted a budget for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 that includes a reimbursement of money from an enterprise fund to another fund.

The City's General Fund provides

for services to the Cities Enterprise Funds (Garbage, Water, Sewer, Storm Drain and Street Lighting). Those Enterprise Funds are charged Administrative Charges for the staff time needed to coordinate those services to recoup costs to the General Fund. Administrative Charges are determined by an annual study which takes

into account budgetary changes from year to year. In addition, some Enterprise Funds (Water, Sewer, and Storm Drain) are charged annually to cover their share of debt expenses paid through the Debt Service Fund.

*Personnel Services include; Human Resources services, Custodial Services, Utility Billing services, IT services, Finance Department services, Public Works Admin (PW admin is budgeted in the General Fund), Streets Department (Streets department assists the Enterprise Funds in some functions), Legal services, City Recorder services

*Non-Personnel Services include; Bank charges, Insurance costs, Auditing services, Utility expenses, various office expenses



It's that time of year again. Firework stands are popping up on every corner, the family is in town, and you just can't wait to take a bite of that chargrilled burger. There's nothing better than a summer

holiday. Just remember, when everything's said and done, dispose of those used fireworks properly!

Leaving fireworks on the road can cause serious problems for our storm drains. If not properly disposed of, fireworks can get swept into storm drains. When that trash piles up, it can create clogs and even lead to flooding. In addition to flooding, storm drain trash can also be washed into the waters of the state, such as Utah Lake or the Jordan River if it's not

cleaned up.

So how do we prevent it?

You can dispose of fireworks correctly by dropping them into a bucket of water. Once the firework is saturated, it can be removed and thrown into your garbage can. You should then dump that water onto the grass, and not into the curb or gutter.

Emergency Preparedness Light & Power



In a disaster situation when emergency services are overwhelmed and professional medical care may be unavailable, it is vital to have a basic understanding of first aid and have necessary medical supplies on hand. Your personal health is of paramount concern, especially during an emergency. Disasters can be physically and emotionally taxing. You are much more likely to get through the incident if you are physically fit. Additionally, when you are healthy, you are in a better position to be of help to others.

“Be Ready” for medical and health emergencies with proper first aid training, first aid supplies, and personal health.

*Determine yours and your family's unique health and medical needs.

*Make a plan to meet those health and medical needs in an emergency without outside help.

*Update prescriptions, and when possible, keep a few week's supply of medications on hand.

*Build a supply of first aid and medical supplies at home.

*Become first aid certified and maintain your certification.

*Become CPR and AED certified and maintain your certifications.
