Saratoga Springs Remembers Former Mayor Mia Love for Her Dedicated Service



The City of Saratoga Springs mourns the loss of an early City leader who played a pivotal role in shaping the community's future. Mia Love dedicated 12 years to public service in Saratoga Springs, serving on the City Council from January 1, 2004, to December 31, 2009, and as Mayor from January 1, 2010, to December 31, 2013.

During her time on the City Council, Mia worked closely with residents and fellow council members to establish a

planning commission, create a City library, and develop a long-term vision for Saratoga Springs. Following the 2008 Global Financial Crisis, she collaborated with other City Council members and then-Mayor Parker to build a more sustainable tax base, ensuring the city's financial stability.

As Mayor, Mia played a crucial role in expanding the city's economic foundation by working with developers to begin the creation of key commercial centers, including The Crossing shopping center. Her leadership helped strengthen the city's economic resilience and growth.

Mia demonstrated exceptional leadership during the 2012 mudslides and flooding in the Jacob's Ranch neighborhood. In the aftermath of fires and torrential rain, she coordinated efforts with city staff, religious leaders, the State, and volunteer organizations to support cleanup and mitigation efforts, helping affected residents receive the assistance they needed. *Continued on Page 4*

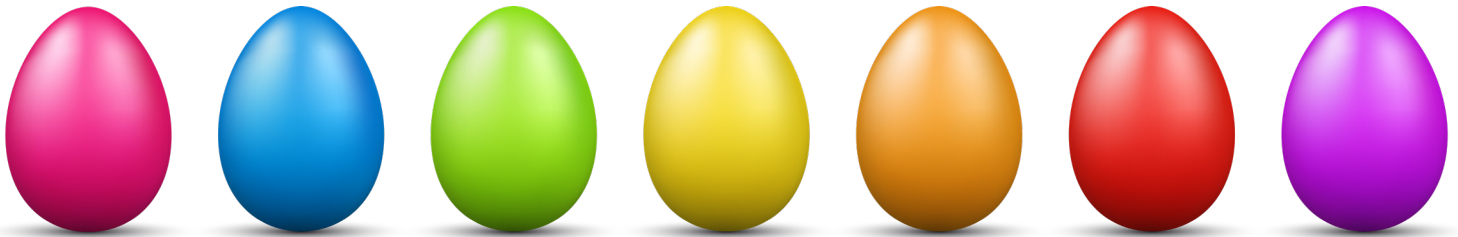

Free E-Waste Disposal in April By: The Storm Water Department

What is E-waste?

Simply stated, E-waste refers to any electronic device that has been discarded. This includes commonly used items such as computers, laptops and televisions. However, E-waste contains numerous toxic chemicals that can have harmful effects on the environment, and consequently needs to be properly disposed of at an e-waste station.

When disposing of E-waste at a waste

station, a fee typically applies. But, during the month of April, North Pointe Solid Waste Special Service District will be accepting E-WASTE FOR FREE. With this in mind, now might be the best time to dispose of that old outdated TV, broken computer, or other electronic items just collecting dust.

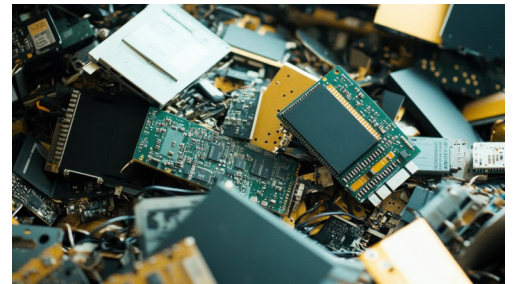

Emergency Preparedness Food Storage & Nutrition



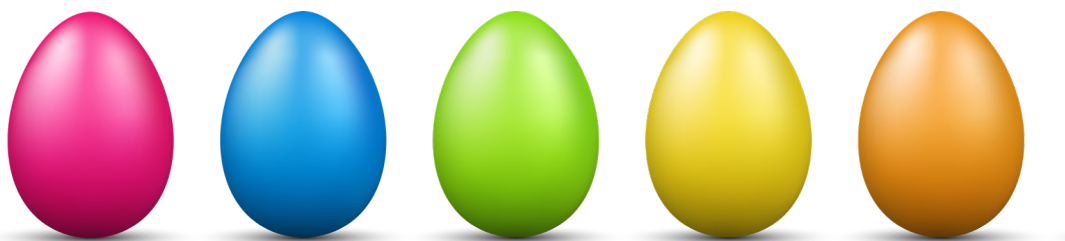
The second emergency after an initial disaster is disease outbreak. Improper hygiene and sanitation lead to deadly diseases like typhoid, dysentery, and cholera. Prevent disease and illness by keeping yourself and your surrounding environment clean.

- Gather emergency sanitation supplies including at least one month or more of toilet paper, feminine hygiene as needed, hand sanitizer, paper towels, garbage bags, and cleaning supplies.
- Add hygiene and sanitation

supplies to your disaster supply kit.

- Create a hand washing station and add it to your emergency supplies.
- Create a “port-a-potty” kit (available at beradyutah.gov) and add it to your emergency supplies.
- Gather supplies for doing laundry and dishes by hand. Teach household members how.
- Add hygiene and sanitation supplies to work and school emergency kits.
- Check with your local municipality on what local plans and regulations are in place for local disposal of garbage and human waste in the event of an emergency.
- BONUS: Practice proper outdoor hygiene and sanitation by going camping. Learn how to safely create and use a latrine.
