2025 Municipal Election Information

The 2025 Municipal Election for the City of Saratoga Springs, Utah, will be held on November 4, 2025 to elect the following offices to serve a four-year term each, from January 2026 to January 2030:

- Mayor
- City Council (2 positions)

Candidacy Filing Period:

June 2, 2025 through June 6, 2025, Monday – Friday, business hours 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM at the City Recorder's office, 1307 N. Commerce Drive, Suite 100, Saratoga Springs, Utah 84045.

2025 MUNICIPAL PRIMARY ELECTION August 12, 2025 (if required)

2025 MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION November 4, 2025

Candidate Qualifications:

- Candidates must be a United States citizen at time of filing for candidacy.
- Candidates must be at least 18 years of age at the time of the next municipal election.
- Candidates must be a legal resident of the municipality for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.

• Candidates must be a registered voter of the municipality.

• Pursuant to Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to vote or hold elective office is restored as provided by statute.

Breakfast With Planners

Water Softener Discharge Safety

Household water softener systems generate wastewater when the system flushes the resin during regeneration. That wastewater is typically directed to a floor drain, which drains to the City's sanitary sewer. As such, an air gap is necessary to provide a physical barrier between the softener discharge and the wastewater in your drain.

If the softener drain hose is inserted into the floor drain and happens to be

submerged within existing wastewater in a P-trap or other device, that wastewater may be pulled up and into your softener system, which may contaminate your drinking water. Installing and maintaining an air gap on the softener discharge hose is critical in protecting your home's drinking water supply.

A recommended air gap consists of approximately at least a 1.5" space between the end of the discharge tube

from your softener system and the top of the floor drain. This can be accomplished several ways. A common air gap is prepared using a specialized T-fitting to maintain that separation. You will find further information, including videos and diagrams, online to show you how this may be accomplished. If you have further questions, please contact a certified plumber.

Vacation Safety Tips

School will be out soon, and you may be headed out of town to visit family and friends over the summer. If you are leaving town, take some safety precautions before you enjoy your fun.

- Ensure your children's car seats are installed safely. We provide car seat checks by appointment. Call (801) 420-6326 to schedule with Melissa.

- If you are headed on a road trip ensure your car is ready to go with proper tire air pressure and alignment. Tire and alignment issues can cause less fuel-efficient trips and possibly accidents.

- Be cautious about what you post on social media (80% of burglars used social media to find their next target). Countdowns, check-ins, and photos all show others when you aren't home.

No matter how long you are gone be sure you protect your house when you leave it.

- Turn on lights, the radio or TV so it looks like someone is home

- Be sure to lock windows and doors when you leave, even if it is only for a few minutes

- Turn on home security alarm systems or other security features through your smart home systems

- o Most smart home platforms such as Alexa, Google, Apple, Wyz, etc. have a security feature you can turn on when you leave your house. This feature will alert you if the system hears broken glass, smoke, or carbon monoxide alarms while you have it turned on.

- Put a hold on your mail at the USPS website. www.usps.com/manage/hold-mail.htm

- Tell your neighbors, friends, or family members you will be out of town so they can watch your house, feed your pets, grab mail (if you didn't put it on hold), newspapers, or packages, mow your lawn, and bring out your trash/recycling bins. All of these things help to make it look like someone is still home and the house isn't vacant and an easy target for burglary.

- Store valuables, cash, and car keys in a locked safe

- Put your lights on timers.

- Turn off water at fridge and toilet to avoid any flooding
