Water Conservation & Future Sustainability

In 2015, Saratoga Springs City officials saw an increasing need to address an unsustainable trend in high irrigation water usage. This trend was further compounded by a rapidly growing population and a flat rate system that was not financially sustainable, nor did it encourage water conservation in an arid climate.

At the time, homes and businesses were using levels of irrigation water that far exceeded the allotment of water rights tied to their individual properties. When each new home or business development is built in the City, a specific allotment of water rights is dedicated to the City for the property to use.

When homes and businesses use more than their allotment, it begins to dip into the allotted water rights of other property owners. When several properties exceed their allotment, it then increases the financial burden of the City to purchase more water rights and invest in additional capital infrastructure to supply the larger amount of water being consumed.

Unfortunately, property owners across the City were using far more than their allotment of water every month during the irrigation season. This level of water usage, coupled with one of the fastest growing populations in Utah, was proving unsustainable for the City to fund the needed additional infrastructure and continue to operate the system.

To encourage residents and businesses to lower their water usage, the City switched from a flat-rate system to a per-thousand gallon, tiered system that is based on the lot size and allotment of water

rights of a property. In addition, the City lowered the per-acre base rate, which took into account the months that residents and businesses were not using irrigation water.

As a result, if a property owner now uses less than their allotment they will save money compared to prior years. However, if they use more than their allotment the payment of their bill will now contribute to the capital needed to sustain the higher level of usage.

Fortunately, the City has already seen a dramatic improvement in water conservation. Since implementation in 2015, city-wide water usage by residents and businesses decreased from nearly 1 billion gallons in 2015 to less than 800 million gallons in 2016—a 21 percent decrease—despite rapid growth. However, more telling than the total city-wide usage was the average usage per customer decreased by 27 percent per customer among residents and businesses.

As we continue to yield these more sustainable levels of water usage and conservation, we will better ensure that our community has adequate infrastructure capacity, funding, and staff resources to feasibly support the growing need for increased capacity for years to come.

To help further the water conservation effort, please remember to adjust your irrigation system to use less water as temperatures cool. To determine your water allotment, please check your monthly water bill. To determine what water usage is right for your home or business and estimate your monthly bill based on your acreage and usage, visit Saratoga Springs City's website at www.saratogaspringscity.com and click on the "Irrigation Calculator" link in the right-hand sidebar. 

Parking On Public Streets

All those that live, work, and play in Saratoga Springs want a safe and desirable community. Our city council, police department, code enforcement and residents all must work together to achieve these goals.

Recently, the city council adopted new traffic and parking ordinances. These changes can be found on the city's website. Please familiarize yourself with our city code. The following are a few points we all need to remember:

- Parking a vehicle in one spot on

a public street for more than 48 hours is prohibited. 13.08.06

- It is unlawful to keep any trailer, unattached camper, or boat on a public street. 13.08.05

- All vehicles used on or parked on public streets, must have valid registration and both front and rear license plates. 13.08.08

- It is unlawful to park a motor vehicle or trailer on a city street, highway, or shoulder area for the purpose of displaying it for sale. 13.08.07(3)

September 10th – 16th Plan to Help your Neighborhood and Community.


September 17th – 23rd Practice and Build Out Your Plans.

Library Growing Leaps & Bound

This summer was busier than ever for the Saratoga Springs City Library. Our patron counters had an astounding count of 22,265 people who walked into the library or attended one of our programs in June and July. We had over 34,313 checkouts and we only own 24,000 items.

For residents who have lived in Saratoga Springs for a while, you've seen the growth in the library over the last five years. We've expanded our business hours from 20 hours a week to 52 hours a week. Programming has increased from one story time a week to multiple programming opportunities, all

currently listed on our website.

None of this would be possible without the generous support of our volunteers. Next time you attend a story time, or see your child's tutor or a shelper in the library be sure to thank them helping provide these excellent services. Without their volunteer hours maintaining our daily operations would not be possible.

This growth has brought us many opportunities. However, it's also made it much more important for our customers to make sure their children are being safe while they are visiting the library. Please

keep your little ones with you, so that they don't get knocked down or hurt by running into someone, climbing the bookshelves, or performing other acrobatic feats inside the library.

The library is open to everyone, and as such, needs to maintain a safe and comfortable space for all. We ask that children under 5 remain within arm's reach of their caregivers and that children under 8 not be left at the library without an adult present.
