City Councilman Bud Poduska Honoring A Life Of Selfless Service

Saratoga Springs City Councilman Bernard (Bud) Edmund Poduska, Jr. passed away peacefully at the age of 78 on July 12, 2017 surrounded by his family in his home. Councilman Poduska served on the Saratoga Springs City Council from 2008 - 2017 and the Urban Design Committee from 2005 to 2015.


"Over the last twelve years I have had the privilege of working with Councilman Poduska in the community," said Mayor Jim Miller. "He was

one of the greatest supporters in helping to establish a library in Saratoga Springs, and just through that act alone, his legacy and love for education will carry on."

As one of the early residents in Saratoga Springs, Councilman Poduska also served as the first Bishop for The Church of Jesus-Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Lake Mountain area. Every year his congregation would need to be divided as the area continued to grow at a rapid pace.

"Councilman Poduska was a man who not only loved his community, but loved life



and put families first in all his decisions," said Mayor Jim Miller. "My prayers are with the Poduska family, that they may find comfort in the knowledge that he has touched and inspired so many lives."

He enjoyed over 40 years of marriage with his wife Barbara, raising five children to adulthood, and now has 18 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. In his own private practice, Councilman Poduska provided marriage and family counseling to several clients over the years,

with the goal of helping them live a rewarding and fulfilling life.

He earned a Ph.D. in Marriage and Family Therapy and a M.S. and B.S. in Psychology. He retired after having taught at colleges and universities for over 35 years, with 21 years at Brigham Young University where he was the associate chair of the department of Marriage and Family - Human Development for eight years. He also served as an adjunct professor at Utah Valley University.

He authored numerous books on personality adjustment, managing stress, personal finances and his experiences growing up in a homeless family. He also served honorably in the US Army at the missile range in White Sands, New Mexico, from 1959 until 1962.

Saratoga Springs contracted with the Utah County Clerk for administration of the Saratoga Springs 2017 Municipal Elections using Vote by Mail (VBM). The Utah County Clerk's office mailed ballots 21 days before the election to active voters.

An active voter is a voter that has voted at least once in the last four years. Inactive voters may re-register to update their voter registration to receive a ballot in the mail. UDOT Redwood Road Improved

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is improving Redwood Road south of Pioneer Crossing in Saratoga Springs over the next two years. The improvements, which begin summer 2017, are designed to reduce congestion and extend the life of the roadway.

Crews have started to resurface Redwood Road in south Saratoga Springs. The resurfacing area is from Village Parkway south, approximately 10 miles. Crews will resurface wider areas of the road first, then work from north to south to resurface the main roadway. Work hours will be Monday through Saturday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. from now until late July.

Speed limits have been temporarily reduced by 10 mph on Redwood Road from Village Parkway south, approximately 10 miles.

Speed reductions will help to

provide crews a safe work zone and will remain in place for the duration of the resurfacing work, which is anticipated to be completed by fall 2017.

Night work begin late July and will last approximately three weeks. During this time crews will work between Village Parkway and Harbor Parkway. Once this section of road is complete, crews plan to switch back to daytime hours. Nighttime hours will be Sunday through Friday from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. By working at night, crews are able to avoid affecting traffic during peak travel times and accelerate project completion.

Upcoming Work

- Road widening from 400 S to Lake View Terrace Rd is anticipated to begin in the next few weeks
- Dual left-turn lanes at Grandview Blvd will be constructed as part of the road widening

New Neighborhood Traffic Calming Policy Adopted



The goal of the newly adopted traffic calming policy by the City Council on July 18, 2017 aims to improve safety, quality of life and overall livability for residents, bicyclists and motorists in our neighborhoods.

There are two levels of traffic calming measures. Examples of Level One include signage, pavement markings, radar speed trailers or targeted law enforcement. Level Two calming examples may include raised intersections, center island narrowing, curb extensions, street narrowing or traffic circles.

Due to the high demand of traffic calming measures and limited resources, requests for traffic calming measures will be screened for eligibility according to the following criteria:

- The roadway must be either a local or a collector road. Collector roads, due to higher traffic volumes, are only eligible for Level One traffic calming measures.
- Cul-de-sac streets or other dead-end streets are not eligible.
- Composite threshold: speed, traffic volume, accident history, the presence and continuity of sidewalks and nearby sensitive facilities must be met.
- The subject street must be accommodating to traffic calming devices.
- Traffic calming devices must have no adverse effect on motorists, pedestrians or emergency vehicles.



Landscaping & Keeping The Storm Drains Clear

When landscaping or roads. beautifying your yard with delivered materials—whether it's bark, sand, decorative rock, gravel, etc.—those materials should never be dumped in any public right-of-way. This includes streets, sidewalks, curbs and gutters.

Materials should always be dumped in your driveway or yard so that storm water does not carry it away into the City's storm drain inlets. Not doing so can clog the inlets and prevent the storm water from properly draining, which may also cause flooding or overflow on the

As a good reminder when purchasing materials to be delivered to your home, please take the time to prepare an area for the placement of the product. Also, make a plan to use it as quickly as possible so that it does not wash off your driveway and end up in the storm drain from rain or other weather.

Finally, please remember that storm water is not filtered, and that anything that runs down the gutters and streets eventually ends up in our rivers and lakes.
