Snow Removal Prioritization

During the winter months, the City's goal is to keep the streets safe for travel. The City is responsible for approximately 90 miles of road equating to about 180 miles of plowing. City crews conduct snow removal and road salting operations around the clock if necessary during winter storms. In order to achieve this, the City has a prioritized sequence in which the roads will be plowed and salted.

Residents are asked to not park vehicles on roadways during or immediately after a snowstorm to allow snow plows to clear roadways.

During severe storms the Public Works Department may only get to the priority streets as those roads must remain as clear as possible. Second and third priority will get cleared, however it may take a couple days after a large storm to get to them. It is also not the position of the City of Saratoga Springs to maintain a bare pavement policy on every street after a snowstorm given the many other duties of the Public Works Department.

Spring Youth Outdoor Soccer

Registration: January 11 - March 6

Season: Season begins April 16. This will be an 8-game season. Games played Saturdays with possibility of weeknight games.

Cost: \$40; Jersey: \$9. Jerseys are the same as previous years.

Ages: Four years to 9th grade. Shin guards are required for all ages. Everyone who signs up will play.

Registration: January 11 - February 21

Season: Season begins March 3. This will be a 7-game season with a single-elimination tournament (guaranteed 8 games). Games will be played on Wednesday and Thursday evenings.

Cost: \$550 per team; Teams are responsible for their own jerseys.

Ages: Must be at least 18 years old.

Track & Field

Registration: February 6 - April 10

Season: Season begins April 18. Practices will be twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays. Three (3) track meets against other Central Utah recreation track programs. Some travel required to attend meets.

Cost: \$65; includes team shirt, at least 10 practices, and at least 3 track meets.

Ages: 7 years to 14 years old. Age groups follow the United States Track & Field Association (USTFA) age groups which are defined by birth year and not actual age.

Youth Baseball

Registration: February 20 - April 17

Season: Season begins May 24. Games will be played on weeknights and Saturdays. T-Ball & Coach Pitch practices will be determined by the coach as to when and where. Machine Pitch practices will be determined by the coach but will be within specified times the city can supply the pitching machines.

Cost: T-Ball & Coach Pitch \$45, Machine Pitch \$55. Includes team shirt and hat, 8-game season, and participation award.

Ages: T-ball is for Pre-k and Kindergarten ages 4 years old to Kindergarten, must be 4 by the first game. Coach Pitch is for 1st graders, and Machine Pitch is for 2nd graders. School year 2015-16.
