RULES AND REGULATIONS

Fireworks: Fireworks are allowed on specific days during the year. There are restrictions on what types of fireworks are allowed in certain areas of the city. To see an interactive map that shows where fireworks are restricted along with information on what days and times fireworks can be lit, and firework safety tips go to: www.saratogasprings-ut.gov/fireworks

Burn Permit: Burn permits are available through the Division of Air Quality. Residents will also need to call dispatch at 801-851-2876 to establish that it is a legal burn day from Utah Air Quality.

Backyard Fire Pits: Recreational fire pits are allowed within city limits with some restrictions. Rules and regulations and other safety information on backyard fire pits can be found by going to: www.saratogasprings-ut.gov/firepits
