ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS



All waste associated with purchasing, handling, preparing, consuming, and disposing of food in a residential unit.



All waste associated with household and yard management, including packaging, debris from minor house repairs, minimal yard waste including grass clippings, small limbs, etc., discarded clothing, shoes, disposable diapers, paper, broken or discarded household items, etc., as long as the items fit in the garbage receptacle.



Waste associated with household pets, including pet waste and carcasses of dead household pets or portions thereof 10 pounds or smaller.



Other waste items or debris as long as they can be reasonably accommodated in the garbage receptacles and can be handled without damaging Republic Service's collection vehicles.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS



Any materials (garbage or recycling) not contained in the container(s).



Specifically exclude hazardous, radioactive, volatile, corrosive, highly flammable, explosive, biomedical, infectious, biohazardous, toxic or listed or characteristic hazardous waste as defined by applicable law or any otherwise regulated waste.



Waste that is of such volume, weight, and/or composition that it cannot be reasonably accommodated by the collection vehicles.



Waste that poses a danger to the truck and/or operator (examples include, but not limited to: hot ashes, ammunition, hazardous or toxic chemicals or chemical agents, heavy or jagged metal, oversized concrete or rock material, large sumps, large accumulations of human or liquid waste (as from RV holding tanks), unreasonable amounts of sod or dirt or other items that cause a fine dust/particles that is a hazard to the driver and his/her ability to breathe.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS



Flattened Cardboard



Paper - such as newspapers, advertisements, school papers, etc.



Metal Cans - Including aluminum, tin, and other food cans.



Plastic Bottles and Jugs - Including milk, water, cleaner and other plastic bottles.

- All recyclables should be empty clean and dry.
- Recyclables should be placed loose in the recycling can. Never put recyclables in containers and bags.



Plastic Bags and Wrappers



Soiled Paper, Greasy Pizza Boxes, Styrofoam, Diapers



Clothing & Shoes, Toys, Tools,



Yard Waste, Construction Waste, Scrap Metal



Electronic Batteries, Glass, Medical Waste

- All clean recyclables are sorted and recycled.
- Recyclables tainted by unacceptable items are not able to be recycled.
- It is important that unaccepted items are not put into the recycle bin as they can taint a whole truckload of recyclable items.
